What Is A Shrew?



A shrew is this small creature pictured above. This particular shrew was caught in a mousetrap in the Adrian area, but is somewhat different from a regular mouse.

They do resemble a mouse being small and gray in color, but belong to the order of Insectivora and are most closely related to the moles. Among them are the smallest of all mammals, some being scarcely two inches in length. They have a long pointed snout or bill, very small eyes, and velvety fur. Shrews are chiefly nocturnal, feeding mostly on worms and insects.

Police Answer Survey Questions

Comment: Police are very lax on drugs.

Answer: Drug enforcement is very expensive and requires many, many hours of investigation usually through the use of undercover agents. Due to this fact it has been the policy of all Malheur County Law Enforcement Agencies to combine the efforts. Approximately four-years ago a MINT, (Malheur Interagency Narcotics Team) was formed. Their policy has been to accumulate narcotic cases over a specified time span and then make mass arrests. Therefore it appears that little is being done which is not always true.

Comment: The South Park needs more patrol especially during the summer months.

Answer: Vandalism and disorder in the parks this past summer and fall resulted in considerable damage to restrooms and sprinkler hoses. The on-duty patrolmen are instructed to step-up patrols of the park areas during summer months but cannot always be there when the offenses occur. The parks are your parks for you to enjoy and I would encourage anyone witnessing any of these acts to immediately

contact the police department. Comment: Police should patrol North 3rd Street better than they do. There are too many speeders.

Answer: Patrolmen try to concentrate their efforts on areas where the greater degree of pedestrian traffic occur—Main Street, school zone and parks. Fiscal year 1975-76 shows 464 citations issued, 140 for the offense of speeding.

Comment: Feel there is too strong police enforcement in area. Feel like the police force is watching for its citizens to make an error so they can be fined. If money is needed to run city, this should be made known.

Answer: The Police Department prides itself in our low accident rate. The last report of a fatal accident occurred in 1974. This we believe is due to effective traffic enforcement.

In reference to fines being levied, the police department has nothing what so ever to do with the amount of the fine. This is handled by the Municipal Judge, and he is governed by law as to the maximum fine that can be assessed for each particular offense.

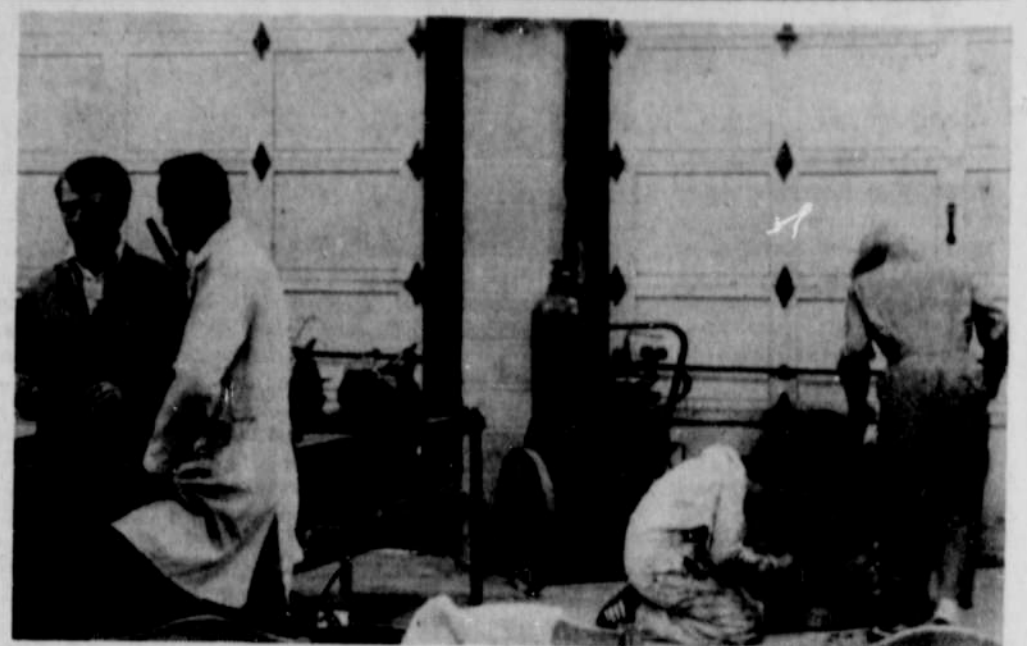
Cold Ceramics - Debbie Edgar, instructor - Starts Wednesday night January 12 at 7 p.m. Cost - your own materials.
