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Seed Growers

Meeting January 10

A grower panel on weed control and a grower-dealer panel on contracting will highlight the annual meeting of the Malheur County Legume Seed Growers Association slated for January 10, at 10 a.m., at the Oregon Trail Hall, says William "Bud" Panike, Association president.

The weed control panel composed of growers Darrell Panike, George Schiemer, Dean Sisson and Bob Ure will be moderated by Malheur Experiment Station Agronomist, Dr. Charles Stanger and will review materials and methods being used by growers to handle weed problems. In addition Stanger will discuss new chemicals recently registered for control of weeds in alfalfa seed.

Another topic of interest in the morning portion of the meeting will be a discussion of public and private plant breeding programs as they relate to development and

release of new alfalfa varieties by Dr. Rod Frakes, Oregon State University plant breeder.

Ed Hardin, director of the O.S.U. seed testing laboratory will report to the group, also, on activities of the lab, and other items related to seed processing and management. To round out the morning program, grower Phil Geertsen will review some activities going on here and around the state related to the OSHA program. This topic will be covered later in the program from another point of view by Lee Ream of the Accident Prevention Division of the Workmen's Compensation Board, State of Oregon.

Of interest to growers, also, Panike says, will be the annual Seed Certification program report by Don Brewer, Extension Seed Certification Specialist. Brewer will discuss specifically the need for greater attention to Canada Thistle control in seed fields.

The final program item is one which is receiving considerable attention of late and will be of interest to everyone involved in the seed business, Panike believes.

Seed contracting will be discussed by a panel composed of John Stubbard, Andrews Seed; C. J. Heath, Pacific Supply; Elmer Zuercher, Union Seed; Phil Geertsen and Nampa grower Leonard Tieg and moderated by Oris Rudd, Malheur County Extension Agent.

The annual meeting program covers a variety of timely topics of interest to seed producers and all are encouraged to attend, Panike concluded.

New Bird of Prey at Zoo

A male golden eagle has been placed on exhibit at the Washington Park Zoo. The four-year-old eagle, named Gerard after a long time friend and supporter of the zoo, Gerard Landon, joined Goldie, the zoo's seven-year-old female in the zoo's new golden eagle exhibit. Presently they are separated by a rope netting until they become acquainted.

Full grown male eagles have a wing span of 6 to 7 feet and weigh 6 1/2 to ten pounds. Female eagles, being much larger, have a wing span of 7 to 7 1/2 feet and weigh up to 13 pounds. They mature at about 5 years of age, and mate for life. Golden eagles are the strongest raptor in the world.
