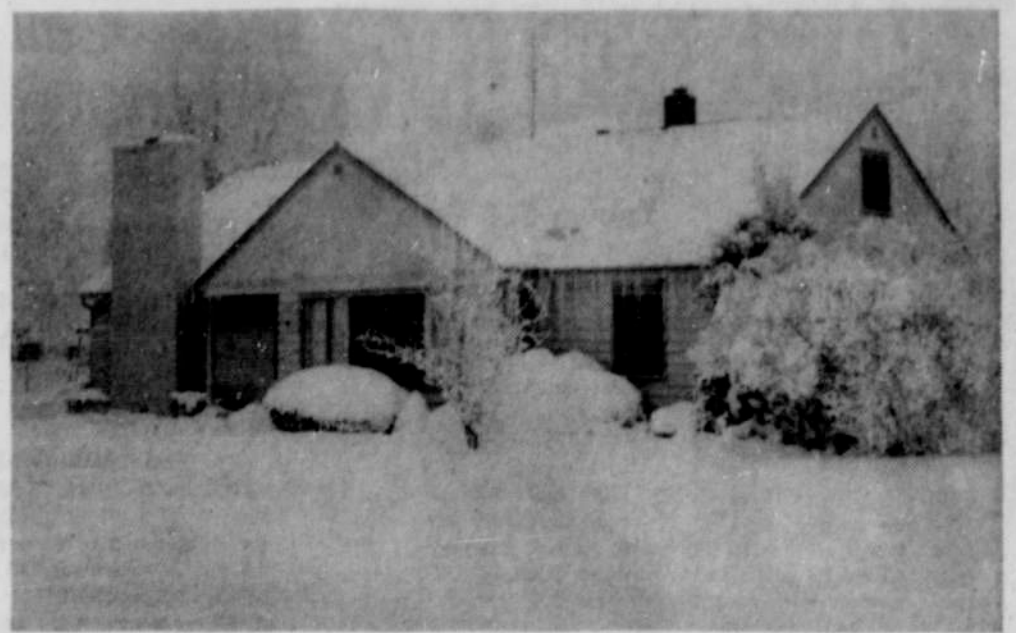
State Police Department

Those applicants who successfully complete all phases of the testing and processing will be considered for openings in October of 1977 and March of 1978.

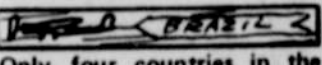
