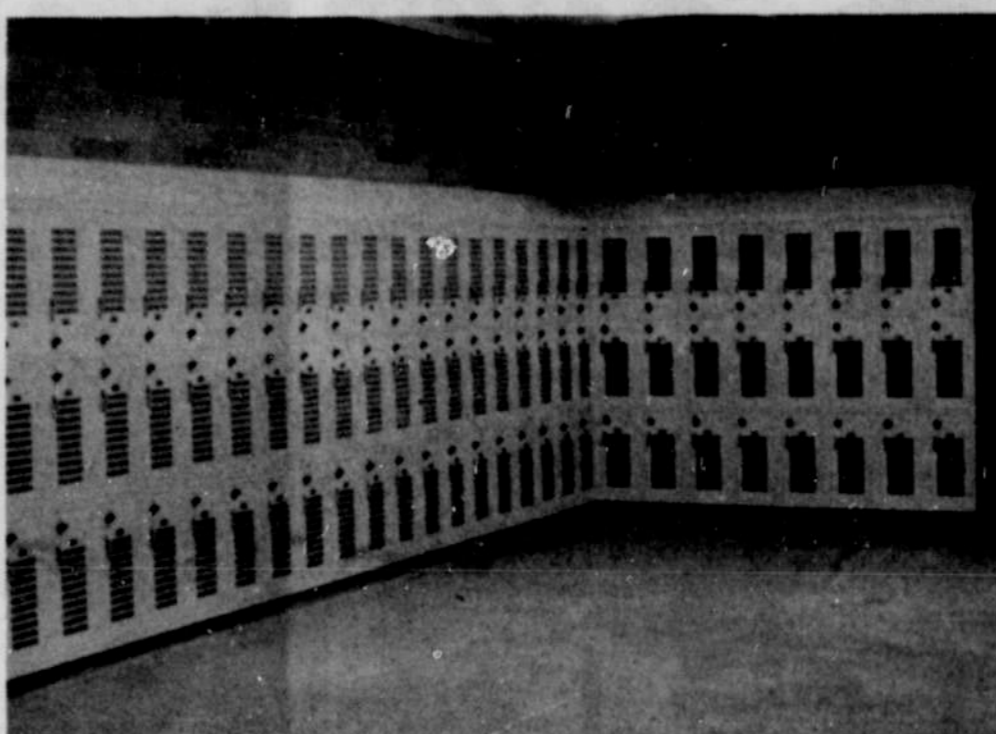

SEALED PROPOSALS for the construction of Exploratory Water Wells, addressed to Honorable Mayor and Council, will be received at the office of the Rural Fire Protection District (Fire Hall) City of Adrian, Oregon, until 8:00 P.M., local time, on the 20th day of January, 1977, and then will be publicly opened and read.  
THE WORK contemplated consists of two six-inch diameter exploratory water wells, approximately 250 to 300 feet deep.  
PLANS and Specifications may be examined in the office of the Engineer, CH2M HILL, INC., 700 Clearwater Avenue, P.O. Box 8748, Boise, Idaho 83707.  
A COPY of the Documents may be obtained at the Engineer's office upon payment of \$15 for each Document. The full amount paid for the Documents will be refunded if the Documents are returned in good condition within 30 days after bid opening.  
BIDDERS must be qualified in accordance with the applicable parts of ORS 279 in order to enter into a Contract for public work in Oregon.  
BIDDERS WHO are in doubt as to their status with the Owner regarding qualification for the type and size of work contemplated herein are encouraged to contact the Engineer informally to determine if a prequalification request is necessary. If determined necessary, prequalification requests must be submitted to the Owner on, or before the bid opening date. Prequalification application forms may be obtained at the office of the Engineer. The Owner will investigate and determine the qualifications of the apparent low Bidder prior to awarding Contract.

NO PROPOSAL will be received or considered by the City of Adrian, unless the Proposal form contains, or is accompanied by, a statement by the Bidder as a part of his Proposal that the provisions required by ORS 279.350 shall be included in his Contract.  
EACH PROPOSAL must be submitted on the prescribed form, payable to the City of Adrian, Oregon, in an amount not less than ten (10) percent of the amount bid.  
THE SUCCESSFUL Bidder will be required to furnish the necessary additional bond (s) for the faithful performance of the Contract, as prescribed in the Contract Documents.  
BIDDERS on this work will be required to comply with the provisions of the President's Executive Order No. 11246 and requirements issued thereunder. The requirements for Bidders and Contractors under this Order are explained in the Contract Documents.  
THE ATTENTION of Bidders is directed to the requirements and conditions of employment to be observed and minimum wage rates to be paid under the Contract.
