Representatives of the Amalgamated Sugar Company and beet growers of Utah, Idaho and Oregon agreed after negotiations held in Boise last Friday on a price of \$14.50 per ton for sugar beets in 1947.

The contracts, calling for the highest price ever paid for beets are expected to be ready for growers to sign after February 1.

Fear of a flood in Nyssa has been a worry to many people in Nyssa, but according to a report made this morning by

reclamation engineer, they feel the danger is not great unless the Snake makes an unusual abnormal and sudden rise. A route for trucks has been mapped out and the CCC Camp has agreed to help in case of emergency, along with the reclamation forces here.

It is believed that should the river rise to a threatening level, a crew of men could throw in a dike across the Wilson ditch approximately 100 yards from the mouth of the ditch, which would hold back flood waters.

Nyssa was visited by a flood in 1910, the water coming down the Wilson ditch during an unusually heavy spring run-off. At that time the Wilson ditch was in active use carrying water to

Ontario. Since 1910, there have been numerous irrigation dams along the Snake and its tributaries, including the Owyhee, Arrowrock, American Falls, Magic, Black Canyon, Salmon and others; so that a flood from a high runoff is extremely unlikely.

The danger at the present time is in the ice in the river. The water is entirely frozen over near Nyssa and practically so from below Weiser extending to Homedale. However, residents here remember in 1924 when the river was frozen over and there was no flood. Should the ice jam, and form a barrier in the river, it would likely flood over adjacent ground until the barrier was removed, either by force of the river or

by dynamite.

## 50 YEARS AGO

A measure providing for the establishment of 13 junior colleges throughout the state with the avowed plan of widening the state educational opportunities and relieving congestion in the higher institutions of learning, was introduced in the House by Roberts of Wasco County.

It is provided that the state be divided into districts and the voter in each district may establish colleges and vote funds for operating them.

Cities in which the colleges would be located are: Portland, Astoria, Salem, Albany, Marshfield, Medford, The Dalles, Pendleton, Kla-

mah Falls, Baker and Vale.
