Local Officers Attend State PTA

The January meeting of the OCPTSA (Oregon Congress of Parents, Teachers and Students Association) was held January 13 and 14 in Portland. Attending from this area were Virginia Cleaver, Region VIII vice president, and Betsy Winkle, Malheur County Council PTSA president.

At this meeting, resolutions were made on bus safety, child abuse, TV violence, and 50% state aid to school finance with property tax relief. These resolutions will be presented to the delegates at the Oregon state convention. The U.S. Supreme Court gave a decision that upheld the right of a teacher to use spanking for discipline. The State of Oregon has proposed an amendment to the Administrative Rule which would bring the state rule in line with the court decision. This amendment with its written procedures and controls was studied.

A report was made by the Convention Committee about the 1977 State PTSA Convention to be held April 21, 22, and 23 in Ashland. Registration this year is \$50.00, which includes most of the meals. Besides other business to be conducted, the delegates will vote on PTSA resolutions. Many workshops will be offered, some tours and entertainment one evening at the well-known Shakespearean Theatre.

The nominating committee proposed the nomination of Betsy Winkle as vice president of Region VIII, to succeed Virginia Cleaver, who is retiring after serving this region for the past 20 years.

Mrs. Cleaver is serving on the program committee for the state convention, and among the topics for discussion are: "Test Scores, what they mean," "Working with Difficult Administrators," "Notice, This School Closed," "You and the Law," "Juvenile Justice," "Legislation and the PTA," "Health Education in the School," and "Group Motivation."

Malheur County will host the state convention in April, 1978. Mrs. Cleaver and Mrs. Winkle will ask for help from local PTA's to help insure the success of that convention.

Hints for HOMEMAKERS

Tested Tips To Help You

Ball point pen ink. Sponge this stain repeatedly with acetone or amyl acetate. Washing often sets ball point ink stains.

Fruit or berry stains. Stretch material over a large bowl and pour boiling water through the stains. If stains remain, bleach with hydrogen peroxide or chlorine bleach. Camphor will remove fruit stains from table linens if it is applied before the cloth is wet.

Coffee. Soak cloth overnight in large pan of strong vinegar water and hang in sun while dripping wet. Then wash as usual. You can use commercial coffee pot cleaners.

Streamline your laundry schedule by doing a load or two each day at dinnertime, when you're pre-occupied with domestic things, anyway. Fold the clothes while you're waiting for the coffee to perk. Or, make it a family venture, by letting the kids fold their own, while you have a gab fest about their daily activities.
