Rival Matmen Spoil Nyssa's Gym Opener

Nyssa invited three of the better wrestling teams around to help inaugurate its new gymnasium over the weekend.

And while six individual Bulldogs came through with winning records in the three-match series, it was probably a mistake to schedule Crook County, Parma and Madras within a two-day span.

Nyssa lost all three matches, falling to Crook County 52-12, Parma 33-32 and Madras 40-24, with varying degrees of success.

The Bulldogs had a good shot at Parma and maybe a forfeit as 191 pounds was the difference. Nyssa, which does not have a 191-pounder, forfeits that weight in every match, and this time it came back to haunt them.

Parma held a one-point lead going into that match and went quickly on top by seven at 33-26. Not even a pin by heavyweight Robert Fehlman could make up the difference.

Crook County, Oregon's top-rated AA team, and Madras, another toughie from the Greater Oregon League, simply had more depth than the Bulldogs could handle.

Despite the losses, 141-pounder Bill Tensen battled to an unbeaten weekend with a 2-0 record and five other Bulldogs came away at 2-1.

Pat Sims at 106 pounds, Jessie Rodriguez at 115, Don Lawrence at 136, Rawleigh Perez at 178 and Fehlman all lost once against some rugged competition.

Fehlman won two of his matches by pins and suffered his first loss of the year against six wins. The other winners also kept outstanding records intact—Perez at 13-3, Sims and Rodriguez at 11-3, Tensen 10-3 and Lawrence 12-5.

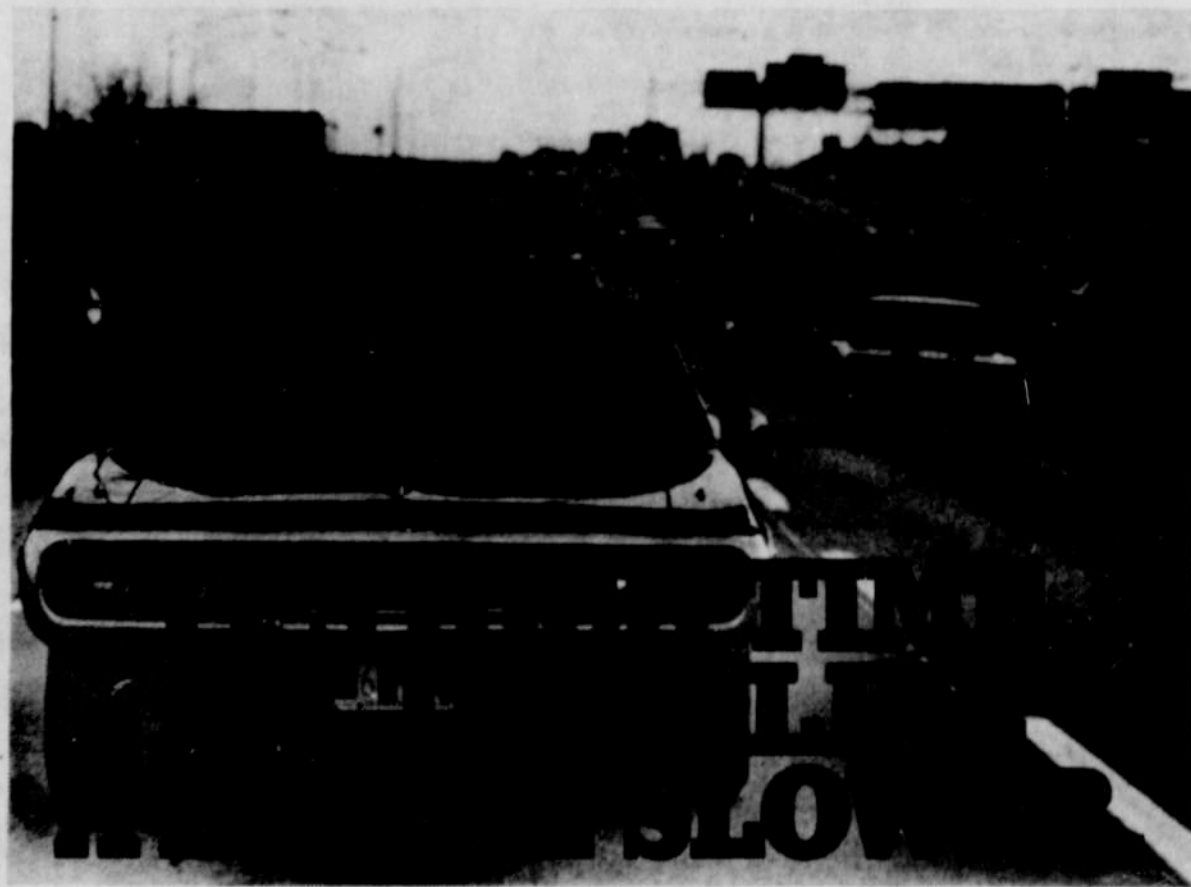
