Oregon Events

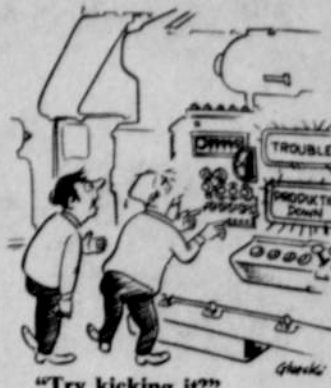
Brochure Out
