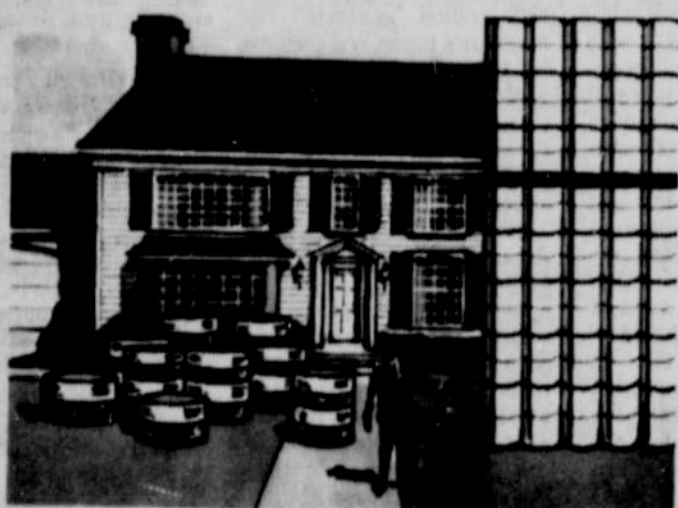


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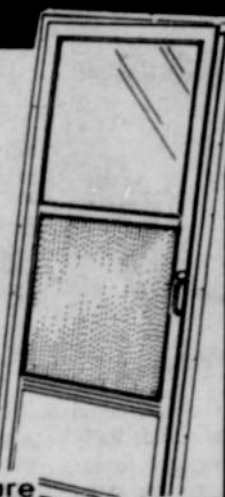
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News From Big Bend

Summer Work Applicants For Oregon Parks Due

Persons wishing to apply for summer work at Oregon's state parks will follow different procedures this year than in previous years, according to State Park Superintendent Dave Talbot.

Applicants this year must apply through the Oregon State Employment Service (OSES) offices. Previously, applications were submitted directly to state park headquarters.

Applications for summer park aide positions will be accepted only during March and April at OSES offices, Talbot said. Personal interviews will then be conducted on Saturdays during May at the appropriate district park headquarters and not during school spring vacation as before.

Applicants must be at least 18 years old, in sound physical condition, hold a valid Oregon driver's license and have a satisfactory driving record. They should be able to work until school resumes in the fall. Base pay for the park aide position is \$704 per month or \$4.06 per hour.

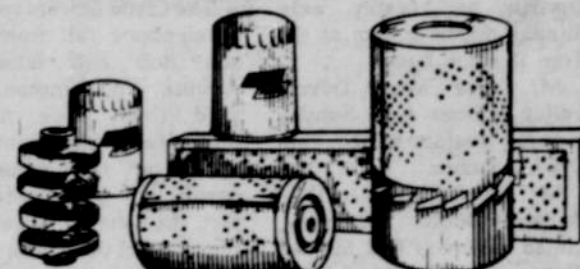
Talbot said about 300 seasonal employees will be hired to maintain the parks this summer. The number of new hires will be limited due to the number of persons who have worked previous summers and are eligible for re-employment. He said the number of applicants always far exceeds the number of positions available.

A pamphlet explaining the park aide position and application procedures has been prepared by the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) Personnel Operations Section, Transportation Building, Salem 97310. It also lists the OSES offices throughout the state. Copies of the pamphlet are on file at ODOT and all OSES offices, as are standard State of Oregon job application forms.



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
