Grazing Fees Analyzed

Livestock grazing fees on lands administered by the Bureau of Land Management and the Forest Service are being analyzed by a joint task force of the Department of Interior and Agriculture.

The action is under a provision of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976.

The task force is charged with preparing recommendations that would establish fees equitable to the federal government and western livestock operators, considering production costs normally associated with domestic livestock grazing in the eleven western states as well as differences in forage values on various lands

administered by the two agencies.

The group will consider recommendations, published February 4 in the Federal Register, made by a technical committee.

The agencies have invited interested parties to submit data, comments and suggestions that would be helpful in their review. They have scheduled a series of public meetings, including one at Rodeway Inn, Room 704, Boise, Idaho, March 11, from 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Oral statements may be made at the meeting and written comments may be submitted by April 8, to Grazing Fee Task Force, Range Management Staff, P.O. Box 2417, Washington, D.C. 20013.

Wool Payment Unchanged for 1977

If it is determined that a payment is required, it will be made in the month of April.

The incentive price of 72 cents a pound for marketings of shorn wool will continue unchanged from the 1976 level, the U. S. Department of Agriculture announced today.

This price is in accordance with the National Wool Act, as amended by the Agricultural Act of 1970 and the Agricultural and Consumer Protection Act of 1973. The National Wool Act, as amended, requires that support shall be at the above level for each of the

marketing years beginning January 1, 1971 and ending December 31, 1977. Pulled wool will continue to be supported at a level comparable to the incentive price for shorn wool through payments on unshorn lambs.

As in past years, shorn wool payments will be based on a percentage of each producer's returns from sales. The percentage will be that required to raise the national average price received by all producers from shorn wool up to the announced incentive price of 72 cents a pound.

Present market conditions indicate that payments may be required on 1976 marketings of shorn wool.
