Planning Portfolio Available

Planning a new or remodeled kitchen is a challenging task that requires lots of decisions. A new "Kitchen Planning Portfolio" is available free of charge from the Malheur County Extension office to assist

those who are building or remodeling a home.

According to Helen Conner Malheur County Extension home economist, the portfolio contains several publications on different aspects of kitchen planning. The basic bulletin, "Guidelines to Kitchen Planning," was written by Dorothy F. Brown, Oregon State University Extension housing-home furnishings specialist. This is a step-by-step guide through the planning procedure, with all of the needed information about space allocations and directions for drawing a scaled floor plan and wall elevations. These plans should assist the homeowner in communicating with the building contractor, cabinet maker, and other profes-

sionals involved in building a kitchen.

Good lighting is essential for eye comfort and for safety, and an adequate supply of electricity in the right places is a necessity. The portfolio includes a fact sheet on kitchen lighting, written by Mrs. Brown, and a fact sheet on kitchen wiring, by Walter E. Matson, OSU Extension agricultural engineer.

Anyone interested in securing a Kitchen Planning Portfolio should stop by the county extension office, which is located in Ontario City Hall. The office is open from 8 to 5, Monday through Friday, closed during the noon hour.
