Governor Sponsors Energy Conservation Contest

Governor Robert Straub has invited school children and high school age youth to send him ideas on energy conservation.

Grade school children are asked to make posters showing how energy can be saved in their communities. Copies of the posters should be sent to the Governor's Commission on Youth for judging. The child making the best poster will be awarded a prize.

High school age youth are asked to write to the Youth Commission suggesting how teen-agers can save energy. Emphasis in the letters should be on the exact estimates of the amount of energy saved.

"What if every teen-ager cut ten minutes off showering time this summer," Straub said, "how many thousands of gallons of water could be saved in three months?"

The writer of the best letter will also be awarded a prize. Rules for the contest can be obtained from school principals or from the county education office.
