REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

- SCHOOL OPERATING LEVY MEASURE**—Purpose: Proposed constitutional amendment limits school districts to two elections per year for operating levy outside tax base unless voters petition for additional elections. After two defeats, school board may authorize operating levy no greater than previous year's operating levy plus not more than six percent. Amount must be less than lowest total operating levy which unsuccessful election would have authorized. Permits legislature to reduce authority in event of school cost reductions. Effective immediately.

- AUTHORIZES ADDITIONAL VETERANS' FUND USES**—Purpose: Proposed constitutional amendment authorizes use of Oregon War Veterans' Fund, now limited to farm and home acquisition loans for qualified veterans, to (1) aid veterans' organizations' veterans' service programs; (2) train county veterans' service officers; (3) aid county veterans' service programs; (4) pay costs of Director of Veterans Affairs as conservator of veterans' estates; and (5) pay costs of Director in otherwise providing services to veterans, their dependents and survivors.

- INCREASES VETERANS' LOAN BONDING AUTHORITY**—Purpose: Proposed constitutional amendment increases the authorized debt limitation of the state, for the issuance of bonds whose proceeds are to be used for veterans' farm and home acquisition loans, from six percent to eight percent of the true cash value of property in the state.

DISPOSICION ESCOLAR PARA GRAVAMENES DE FINALIDAD OPERATIVA

1 Objeto: La enmienda constitucional propuesta limita al numero de dos en cada ano las elecciones de los distritos escolares para la imposicion de gravámenes para finalidad operativa fuera de la base tributaria del distrito, a menos que los electores soliciten elecciones adicionales. Despues de dos rechazos, la junta escolar podra autorizar un gravamen para finalidad operativa que no sea mayor que dicho gravamen para finalidad operativa correspondiente al ano anterior y no mas del seis por ciento de aumento. La cantidad debera ser inferior al menor de los gravámenes totales que para sufragar los gastos de operacion hubieran podido ser aprobados de no haber sido rechazados en las consultas electorales. Permite a la Asamblea Legislativa reducir la autoridad impositiva de la junta del distrito escolar en el caso de reduccion de costos. Tiene efectos inmediatos.

2 Objeto: La enmienda constitucional propuesta autoriza el uso del Fondo de Veteranos de Guerra de Oregon, ahora limitado a la adquisicion de prestamos para fincas y domicilios a veteranos calificados, para (1) ayudar a los programas de servicios a veteranos de las organizaciones de veteranos; (2) adiestrar a funcionarios de servicios para veteranos de los condados; (3) ayudar a los programas de servicio para veteranos, de los condados; (4) pagar el costo del Director de Asuntos de Veteranos como procurador de bienes de veterano; y (5) pagar el costo de un Director a los efectos de proveer otros servicios a veteranos y a sus dependientes y sobrevivientes.

NOTICE OF MEETING OF BIG BEND IRRIGATION DISTRICT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Big Bend Irrigation District sitting as a Board of Equalization will meet on May 17, 1977, at 8:00 P.M. of said day at the residence of George Zueger, secretary, within said District, for the purpose of reviewing and correcting its assessment roll and apportionment of charges for operation, maintenance, and construction charges for the 1977-1978 fiscal year. The assessment of \$5.70 per acre is levied for operation and maintenance of the Big Bend Unit of the District. \$3.32 per acre is levied for operation and maintenance of the Park Unit of the District. \$4.40 per acre is levied to meet the construction and rehab charges (as determined by the Secretary of Interior) of the Park Unit of the District for the 1976-1977 fiscal year.

The annual operation and maintenance charge of \$10.60 per acre for the season of 1977 for the Park Unit is the rate set by the Boise Project Board of Control. All water used in excess of 3½ acre feet is \$2.70 per acre foot.

The assessment roll and record may be inspected by any interested person at the office of the Secretary.
