McGhan New Executive Vice-President of Oregon Farm Bureau

Clare L. McGhan, Secretary-Manager of the Fresno County (California) Farm Bureau since 1967, on June 1 will assume the executive vice presidency of the Oregon Farm Bureau Federation.

McGhan, 55, was selected from among five applicants for the position, which became vacant when Richard Neubauer resigned to join the American Farm Bureau Federation staff in Park Ridge, Illinois.

McGhan is a native of Michigan and attended Michigan State University and Western Michigan State University. After three years in the army in WWII, he farmed for two years and began his organization career as a field representative for the Michigan Farm Bureau. Later, he coordinated community and young people activities.

After 11 years in his home state's federation, he joined the California Farm Bureau as director of field services. He was manager of the Fresno County Farm Bureau Supply Company after five

and half years with the state staff and later assumed his present position. McGhan and his wife will move to Oregon this summer. They have two married daughters and four grandchildren.

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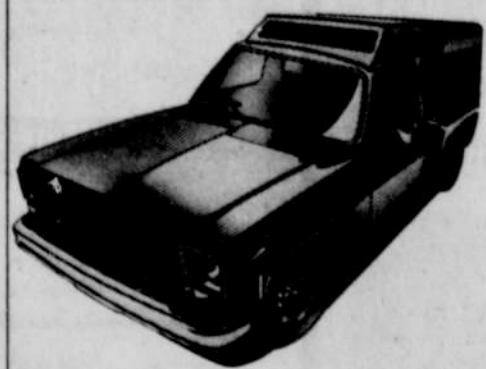
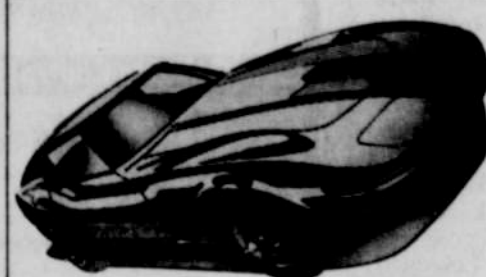
