Oregon State University will graduate its 108th class Sunday (June 5) at 2 p.m. in Gill Coliseum.

The first class in 1870 was composed of one woman and two men. The 1977 graduating class will include more than 3,400 seniors and advanced degree candidates.

The number of degrees conferred each of the last five years has been between 3,400 and 3,500. The record was 3,480 in 1974.

Seniors graduating with scholastic honors will be recognized. Those with grade point averages of 3.75 or better (4 points is straight-A; 3 is B) will graduate with highest honors; those between 3.25 and 3.75, high scholarship.
