He introduced other guests including Circuit Court Judge Frank Yraguen and Mrs. Yraguen, Juvenile Director Jim Mosier and Mrs. Mosier, and Linda Sandlin, Juvenile Counselor. Featured speaker for the evening was Nadja Brogdon, Coordinator of the Adoption Exchange Program with the Western Federation for Human Services. She explained the six state adoption program with which she is involved, stating that infor-

She also discussed the temporary aspect of foster care and changing trends in foster care programs across the country. According to Ms. Brogdon, much is being done to alleviate the problem of foster children being "lost in the system".

Swimming Parties

The special party rate for a maximum of two hours shall be \$20.00 per party consisting of not more than twenty (20) persons plus the regular rates for additional persons under and over eighteen (18) years of age. For purposes of determining the additional charge, the first twenty (20) persons, eighteen (18) years of age or older shall be considered under the basic party rate.
