LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Editor, The Journal:

On April 28, you reprinted a copy of a letter that Larry Hatch of Nyssa sent to me regarding my position on sugar imports. Mr. Hatch incorrectly paints me as being opposed to legislative policies that would help domestic sugar growers. Protecting the growth of the sugar industry is a very serious concern to me, and I would like to take this opportunity to explain my position more fully to you as I have tried to explain to Mr. Hatch in two earlier letters to him. (Copies of my correspondence with him are attached for your information.)

In short, he indicates that my reason for not supporting a system of sugar import quotas is based on my belief that it would encourage domestic sugar production. This is part of one of the reasons why I oppose a new sugar act but Mr. Hatch fails to report the many other reasons for my opposition to this legislation. First, restrictions on imports such as the Sugar Act jeopardize the export of our agricultural products. Other countries will retaliate against our food exports and free trade will be set back even further. Second, the previous Sugar Act was one of the most corruptly administered Acts in our history. Third, I prefer to approach the problem in a different manner. I feel we should impose countervailing duties on subsidized imports to the extent they are subsidized. This would eliminate any undue incentive other countries have to export to this country. As I stated in my letter of April 8 to Mr. Hatch I am willing to assist sugar beet producers in any way possible, short of tampering with the major forces of our free enterprise system. Cordially,

Ample Evidence

WASHINGTON, D.C. (Liberty Lobby News Service)— You've heard of the Gallup and Harris Polls, haven't you? After asking a thousand or so people, Gallup and Harris declare that the entire U.S. population—210 million of us—support or oppose this program or issue, by some percentage. But another poll receives responses from as many as 10 to 20 times the number of people reached by Gallup and Harris: the American Monitor Poll. The American Monitor Poll receives opinions from 15,000 to 25,000 respondents each month. AMP is sponsored by 300-10 Action, a Washington-based citizens action group which delivers the results of the polling to the offices of all congressmen, both representatives and senators. The American Monitor Poll is non-partisan and non-commercial. Its respondents are widely diversified and represent a broad spectrum of citizenship among eligible voters, scattered throughout the country in more than 250 congressional districts. The poll is conducted by volunteer team captains, who contact an average of 20 team members locally each month. Interestingly, AMP's results often contradict Gallup and Harris on many

Well, let's look at the results of a referendum in Massachusetts last November. It was on a proposal that would have virtually banned handgun ownership in the Bay State. Not surprisingly, members of Congress have begun to take note of AMP. Recently the Congressional Research Service of the Library of Congress reported a number of requests from congressmen for information on 300-10 Action and AMP. Some senators and representatives contacted 300-10 Action on their own, to find out more about it or to praise it. The list of congressmen who are relying on AMP to give them dependable reflections of public opinion is bipartisan and non-ideological. Even liberals are noticing AMP. Sen. Richard Stone (D-Fla.) recently contacted AMP to inquire about it. Rep. Holy Rosary for James "Jim" Eiguren, 69, Jordan Valley, Oregon, who died Saturday, June 11, 1977 at home, was recited at 8 p.m. Tuesday, at St. Bernard's Catholic Church, Jordan Valley. Christian Burial Mass was celebrated at 10 a.m. Wednesday at the church by Fr. Noel Hickey. Interment was in Jordan Valley Cemetery, under the direction of Flahiff Funeral Chapel, Caldwell. He was born June 28, 1907, at Trout Creek. He was reared and educated in Jordan Valley, and worked in the sheep business with his father and brothers. He married Alice Mallea March 29, 1932, in Ontario. They lived in Jordan Valley, and purchased the family ranch, which they operated until the early 1960's.
