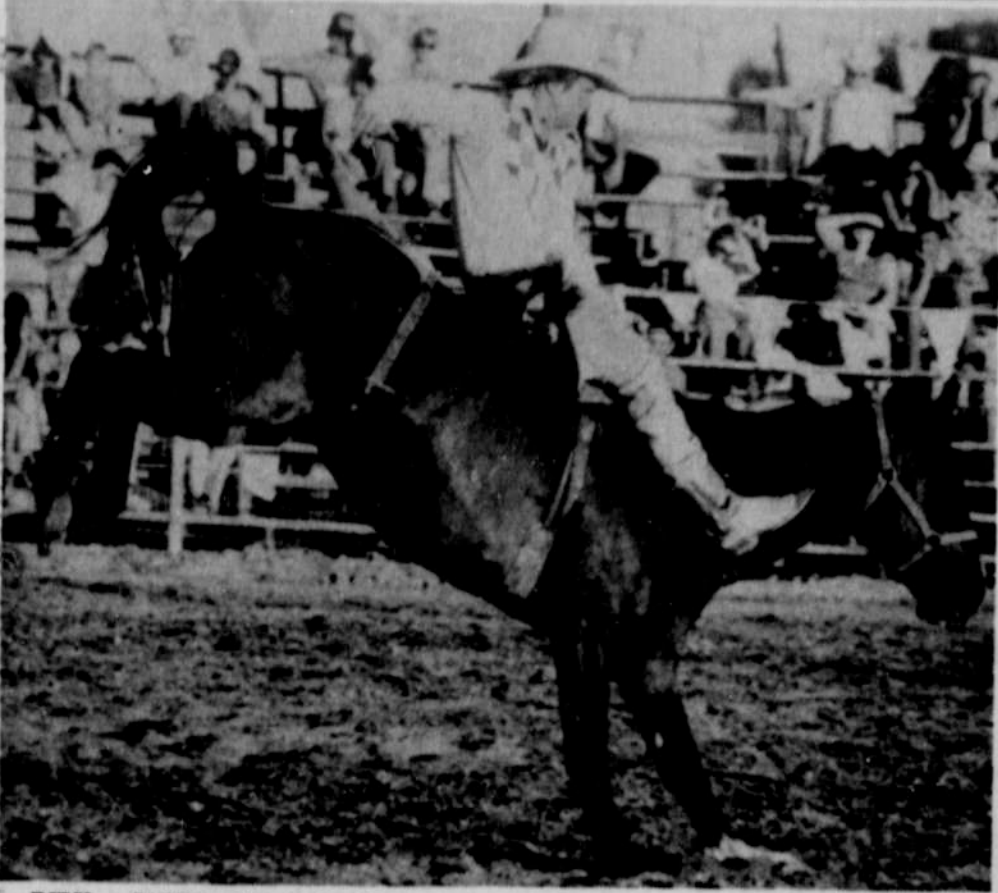




DIRK SAPPE, No. 3 in Oregon, is providing a little entertainment for the crowd on the back of a bucking bronc.

Sappe, Turner Gain Oregon Rodeo Titles

Placing third in bare back bronc riding, in the state of Oregon, in high school competition, is **Dirk Sappe**. Dirk went into the state finals leading, June 17-19 at Redmond, coming home with a third place and a chance to go to Helena, Montana, where the National Finals are held.

Brett Turner also went to Redmond, where he placed seventh in the state of Oregon, in bare back bronc riding. Along with Dirk Sappe who also received a ninth place in the bull riding. The top four position holders in each event will travel to Helena, Montana, August 15-22 to compete in the National Final High School Rodeo.

Dirk started his rodeo career by riding calves in the Nyssa Nite Rodeo. Going then to the Little Britches Rodeo and now High School Rodeos. Mr. Sappe has ridden in five rodeos so far this year. He tries to hit as many rodeos as he can during the season, and has been very successful this year. This year Dirk has won a belt buckle, a first place at John Day and a second at Pendleton in bare back bronc's. On the bulls, Dirk has picked up a fourth at Pendleton and a fifth at Vale.

When Dirk was asked, "What do you like most about rodeoing?" He answered, "The Challenge."

Dirk has received a football scholarship to the College of Idaho, where he plans to attend this fall. Next year, Dirk will further his rodeo career with college competition.

Brett started his rodeo career in high school by joining the rodeo club. He's been working hard in both the bare back and bulls but has not had a very successful season this year.

Mr. Turner has also ridden in five rodeos this season and tries to compete in as many as he can during the year. When asked, what do you enjoy about riding one of those bucking bronses? Brett replied, "I like that thing about man over beast, and just enjoy being out there having the power the rider has."

Both Dirk and Brett went to the Shawn Davis Rodeo School in Vale this spring and have memorable memories about the event.

Many things can happen in a season to give a rider an

unsuccessful season. Such as a bad fall, which may put a rider out for the year. Also before each rodeo, each rider and horse's name is put in a hat and drawn out, giving good luck and bad luck time to set in.

Other cowboys from Nyssa who didn't make the top ten Oregon Finals were: Kevin Cleaver, Calvin Cleaver both bare back and bulls and Eddie Kinkade, bulls.

Traveling along with the cowboys, cheering them on were Mr. and Mrs. Bud Sappe, Dirk's parents; Mr. and Mrs. Roger Turner, Brett's parents; Mrs. Dorothy Sappe, Mrs. Louise Ward, Don Sappe, and Lori Ferrenberg.

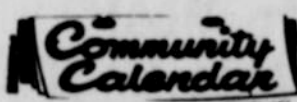
