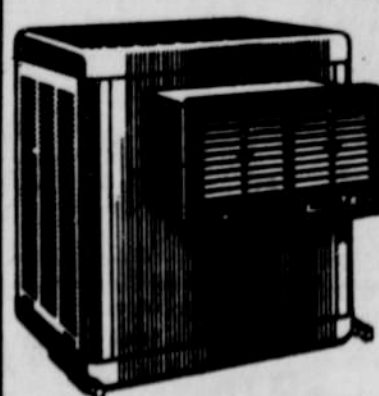

The Briscos were former Nyssa Oregon residents and have relatives in Nyssa and Ontario. Ephretz, Washington

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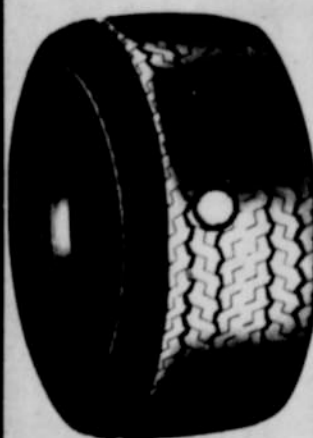
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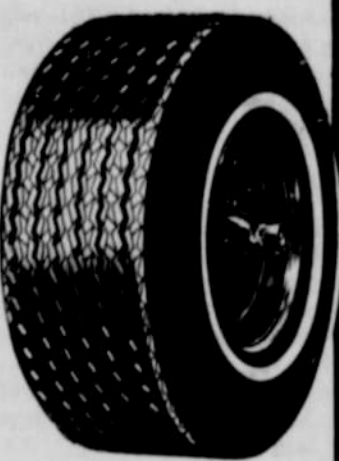
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
