PTA to Speak Out

The strong voice of the National PTA is going to get stronger in the next two years, delegates to the organization's 81st Annual Convention in Anaheim, California, May 15-18, learned.

Grace Baisinger, of Washington, D.C., elected to a two-year term as National PTA president, unveiled her administration theme, "PTA Speaks Out," to the 2,000 convention delegates from the U.S. and Europe, and cited some of the major concerns that will be the focus of PTA efforts.

Among the issues that PTA will speak out on are: TV violence and its effects on children; the PTA will continue and expand its current campaign; the need for creating public awareness and understanding of the collective bargaining process and its impact on education; the effect of federal legislation and public policies on children and their families; the right of the PTA to be part of the decision-making process establishing school policies; securing quality education for all children, particularly the handicapped and the gifted; and the plight of urban schools.

"We believe that the PTA is needed today as never before," said Mrs. Baisinger. "By speaking out, we can make PTA a real power for positive action on behalf of children and youth. In the coming year, we shall make legislative activity a top

priority, for we know that many of the decisions that affect children and their families are made in the halls of Congress and in state legislatures," she added.

A new project in parent education launched at this convention is "The American Family in Focus." Sears, Roebuck and Co. has joined with the National PTA to underwrite a series of eight brochures, with study guides which deal with the trends of the American family and give assistance to parents. The brochures are written by some of the foremost young scholars in the social science field.

Action clinics-forums for discussion and problem solving--spanned a broad spectrum of topics, ranging from such controversial subjects as TV violence, collective bargaining, and busing to parent education, school vandalism, and changing family structure.

City To Receive Funds

City Manager, Henry Schneider, reported that Nyssa will receive an estimated \$13,500 in State Revenue Sharing funds. Attorney Steve Fonda read an Ordinance during Tuesday's Council meeting indicating the City wishes to participate in receiving State Funds.

The 1977 State Legislators passed a measure creating State Revenue Sharing. Under the law, Nyssa's Budget Committee and City Council are required to hold Public Hearings at which the general public may provide input for expenditures.

In as much as the law is to be initiated at once, the two hearings must be completed prior to July 31 or the City will not be eligible.

Council reviewed the criteria and passed upon a broad budget proposal which encompasses Nyssa's immediate needs. After the City Budget Committee conducts a Citizen's Hearing on July 21, a proposal will be to give a safe product, Mrs. Conner said.
