Parents who are interested in enrolling their child in the Nyssa School District Title funded pre-school program should register and establish appointments by August 25 at the primary building. Evaluations will be conducted on September 1, 2, 6, and 7. Pre-school will start on September 12.

Since the four-year-old pre-school program has been discontinued, there will be room for the enrollment of more five-year-olds.

All five-year-olds must be tested for entrance into this program and also, to determine if they qualify for other educational opportunities, such as speech, hearing or any disabilities.
