Scene from Statehouse

 Governor of Idaho
 One of the things I have been doing this summer is to enjoy "brown-bag-in-the-park" lunches with employees in the various state offices in Boise.
 A recent one gave me the opportunity to meet with employees in the Fish and Game and Parks and Recreation departments.
 At each of these picnic lunches I speak briefly, outlining what I believe are the duties and responsibilities of the departments and their employees, and emphasizing that all of us are working together to provide more responsive and efficient service for the people.
 Government is created to do for the people what they cannot individually do for themselves. The people have certain demands for services and they have hopes and plans for the future.
 They have a right to expect that their government will provide those services and will build the kind of a future they want for themselves, their children and their grandchildren.
 At these meetings I have listed certain goals. These are not idle dreams. They are the concrete blueprint for this administration and for all state government. I'd like to review them for you.
 Government in general -- good management, accountability, fiscal efficiency and responsibility.
 Economy -- reasonable, prudent growth based on clean, nonpolluting, stable industries.
 Environment -- responsibility for equal educational opportunities for all our children.
 Energy -- a reasonable, planned and adequate supply of energy for all Idahoans at a reasonable price.
 Wildlife resources -- good management for both wildlife and our hunters and fishermen.
 Recreation -- increased wise and prudent use and development of our recreational potentials.
 Senior Citizens -- lives of dignity and respect, free from the specter of economic suffering.
 All our people -- an Idaho tomorrow that is an even better place to live than our Idaho is today.

Forest Exhibit to Tour Oregon State



APPEALING TO ALL AGE GROUPS, the free display provides basic information on forestry. Walk-through tour takes about 15 minutes to complete.



THE GREAT AMERICAN FOREST traveling exhibit, housed in a suitably painted 42-foot van, will make appearances in numerous Oregon communities for a three-year period.

The Great American Forest, a unique traveling exhibit, is touring Oregon with displays describing the state's forests and explaining the latest advancements in forest management.
 Contained in a 42-foot truck-trailer rig, the Great American Forest exhibit is scheduled for stops in numerous Oregon communities during the next three years. The display will make appearances at local civic celebrations and special events and will be available for schools and other organizations.
 Sponsored by the Oregon Managed Forest Council, an organization composed of several forest products companies which operate in Oregon, the Great American Forest van is a part of the council's communications program launched early in 1977.
 Doug Bartels, chairman of the Oregon Managed Forest Council, said the van exhibit is designed to be educational as well as entertaining for visitors of all ages. Admission is free to the public.
 Exhibits in the van range from illustrations of how a tree grows to descriptions of the recreational, ecological and economic benefits of Oregon forests. The walk-through tour includes audio-visual displays and a puppet show.
 Bartels said the exhibit explains modern forest management practices--such as fertilizing, thinning and efficient timber crop rotation--which enable foresters to grow increased volumes of wood fiber.
 "We feel that proper use of Oregon's forest resources should be a public concern," Bartels said, "particularly in Oregon where 61% of the commercial forest lands are in public ownership. The state's commercial forests provide a timber supply which is the base of support for Oregon's largest industry. At the same time, Oregonians enjoy outdoor recreation on millions of acres of forest lands."
 The Great American Forest exhibit also depicts the role of modern forestry in regard to ecological concerns such as wildlife and forest watersheds.
 Oregon Managed Forest Council member companies are Boise Cascade Corporation; Brooks-Scanlon, Inc.; Champion International Corporation; Georgia-Pacific Corporation; International Paper Company; Louisiana-Pacific Corporation; Pope & Talbot, Inc.; Southwest Forest Industries and Superior Lumber Company.
