Requiem Eucharist Mass for the Rev. William Small Woodman, 72, of 2001 West Boise Avenue, Apartment 19, who died Tuesday, August 23, 1977 at a Boise nursing home, will be conducted at 11 a.m., today, at St. Peter's Episcopal Church, La Grande, Oregon, by Bishop William Spofford and Fr. Sanford Hampton, Episcopal Church. Interment was in Summer-ville (Ore.) Cemetery, under the direction of Daniels Valley Funeral Chapel, La Grande.

He was born June 4, 1905, at Westbrook, Maine, son of Benjamin and Elizabeth Small Woodman. He served as a Navy chaplain in World War II.
