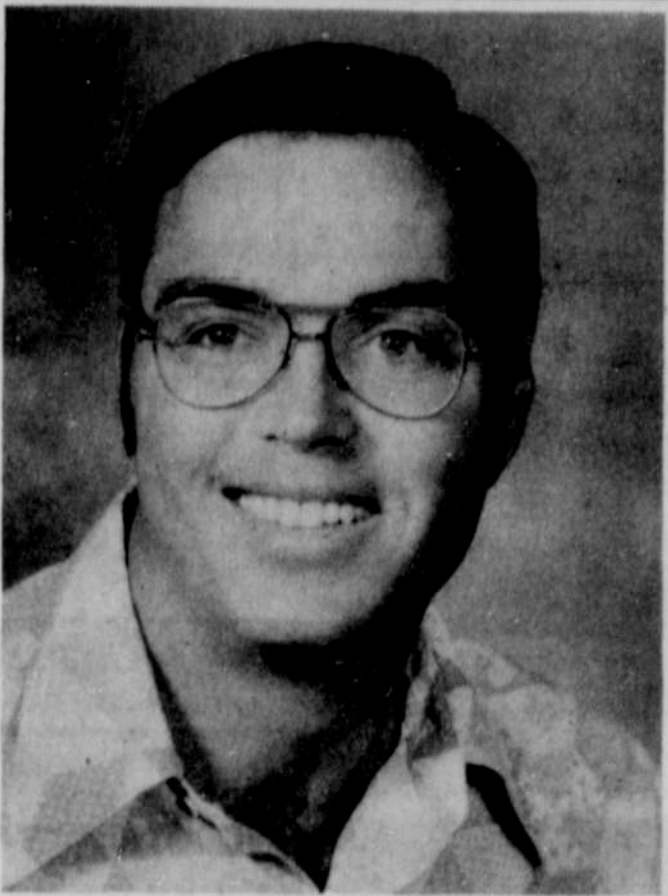

Chaplain Wyatt Smith closed the meeting with prayer. The potluck dinner was followed with Bingo in play.

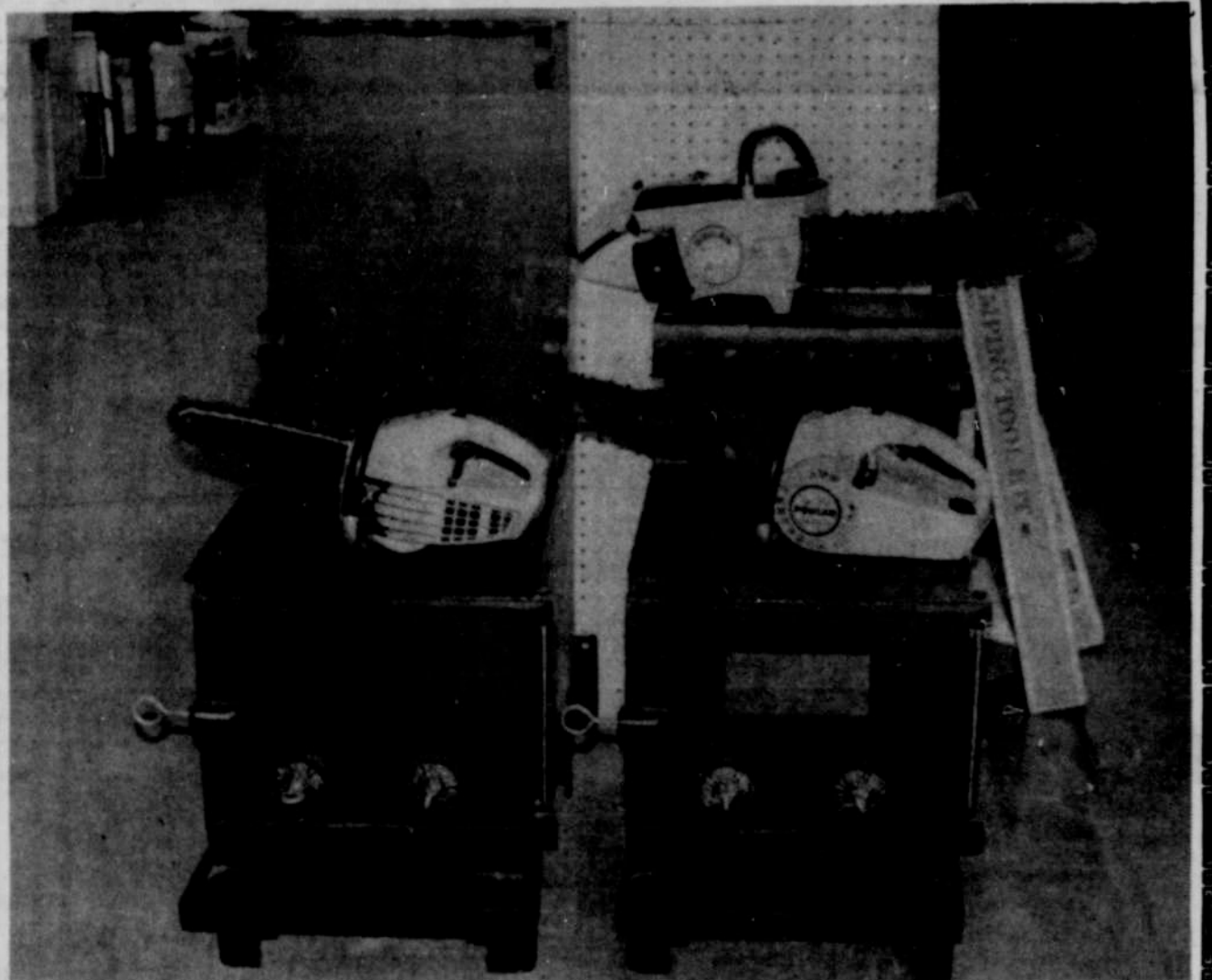

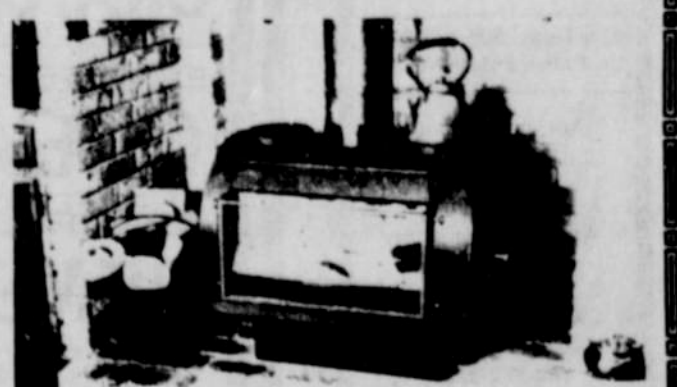
