Burns Captures GOL Win from Bulldogs

How far do you say it is to Burns, Oregon? Well, I know that it is far enough to create great anticipation of watching good football being played. But don't you boosters wish that those people who control such games would let the players do the playing instead of trying overzealously to help them?

The game began with Nyssa kicking off to Burns. The Hilanders immediately proved they were ready to play ball by driving to pay-dirt on their first possession as Ray Cate scored from 13 yards out. During that first drive Nyssa fans saw what was to be an omen of things to come. That was when Jose Delgado was called for pass interference while playing the ball to intercept it. Well, that long drive kind of seemed to rattle the Bulldogs and caused them to lose an outside kick by Burns. Cate scored again for BHS from 1 yd. and after one quarter of play Burns led 14-0.

The Bulldogs finally caught a little spark in the second quarter and scored on a 2 yd. run by Jose Delgado, followed by a good kick by Richard Fehlman. Nyssa had cut Burns lead in half 14-7. But that was about the extent of any offense on that quarter and the half ended 14-7, favor of Burns.

After the intermission, Nyssa got a touchdown on a 15 yd. run by M. Johnson and the PAT attempt failed. Burns' lead was 14-13. Then the Hilanders scored on a 2 yard run by their QB and the kick was good. After three quarters, Burns led 21-13.

The Bulldogs were able to get on the scoreboard on a 7 yard TD run by J. Delgado. The 2 point conversion attempt failed and Burns led 21-19. Nyssa got another

chance late in the fourth quarter, but the Bulldogs gave the ball to Burns on downs and the game was over, Burns winning 21-19.

The QB chores were handled by Mike Johnson first half, and Jim Wilson, the second half. Nyssa managed more total offensive yardage than Burns even while losing.
