Honorary Chairman of the benefit and Mrs. Joe Terteling is General Chairman. Mrs. Terteling reported that last year there were over 19,000 patient visits at MSTI. In one recent month (August) there were 62 new patients in addition to the continuing ones.

Mrs. Terteling said, "At least one family in every three will be affected by cancer in some way so we need every person's help. Cancer can happen to any of us. With so many thousands of people involved, we want to be sure the best treatment remains available in this area."

"Shenandoah" is a hit-Broadway show and was a movie starring James Stewart. It was chosen because it is a Civil War musical, set in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia, and "symbolizes our own war against cancer in the MSTI region," Mrs. Terteling added.

Evening performances in Boise will be November 11-14 and November 17-19. Matinees will be on November 11, 13 and 19. The special matinee on November 11 will be free for senior citizens.
