

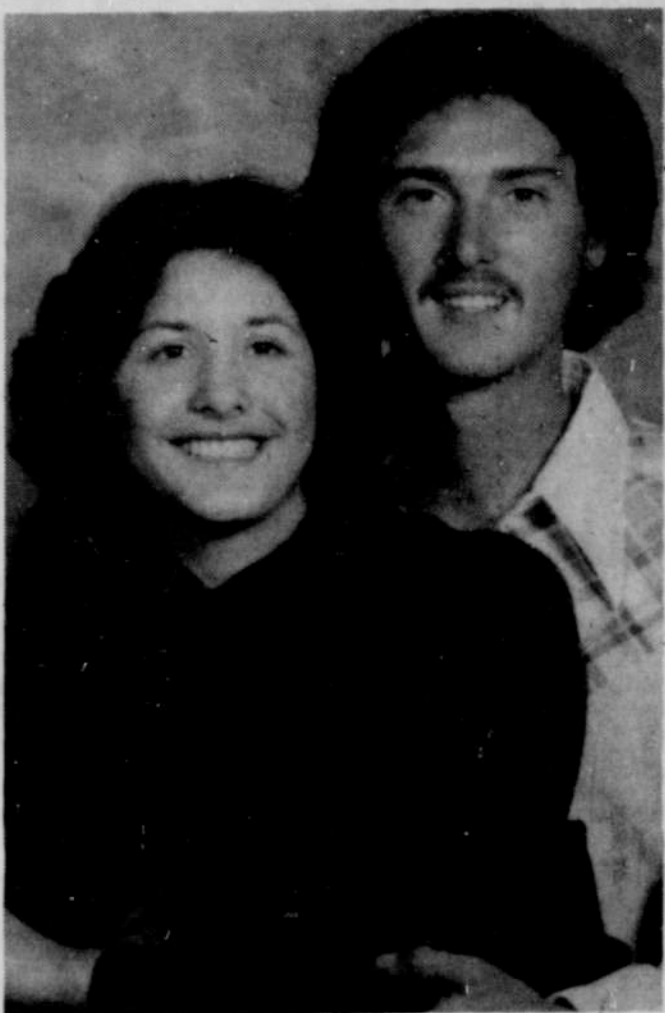
Engagement Announced

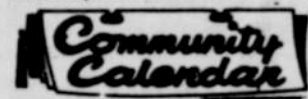
Refreshments were served then the meeting was adjourned.
