FRESH MEAT SCARCITY—The period

of scarcity of meat is now on in Portland, and will not end until about the middle of May, when fat cattle and sheep may be expected from the ranges in Southern Oregon and Northern California. The supply of stall-fed cattle and sheep is said by wholesale butchers to be getting low in Oregon, and this may be considered the period "between hay and grass." Retail prices are not expected to advance from this on, however, though the wholesale rates may go up a little. Beef is now retailing in Portland at 15 to 16 cents; mutton, 5 to 10 cents; and pork, 12 to 13 cents. Choice cuts of beef may go to 20 cents a pound in April, but the general prices will probably remain the same as now. Of recent years, during the fall, when fat stock was plentiful, good beef has been bought in Portland butcher shops for 4 to 12 cents; while mutton and pork were plentiful at the same figures. Retailers say that fresh meat is no higher in Portland now than it usually is at this time of the year.—Oregonian, March 5th.

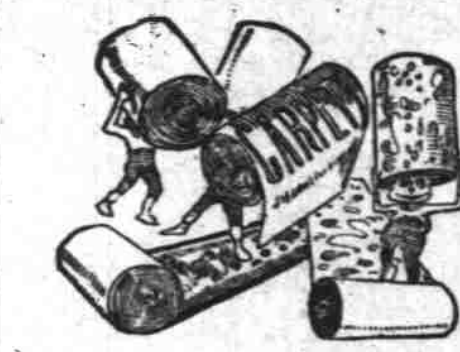
