BOOM IN BELGIAN HARES

A Movement on Foot to Organize a Club in the Willamette Valley.

Many Salem People Will Engage in the Business of Raising Rabbits for Pastime and Profit--Their Meat Delicious and Pelts Valuable.

The Statesman in an issue of a few days ago spoke of the coming boom in Belgian hares for the Northwest--a continuation of the boom that started at Los Angeles and has now taken in San Francisco and all the northern part of the Golden State. There is also a boom in this industry in Colorado, and Denver and Los Angeles both claim the honor of being the Belgian hare center. There is a Belgian hare club already organized in Portland, and a movement is on foot to have one for the Willamette valley. It seems that the boom has also reached Eugene, which is evidenced by the following from the Oregonian of yesterday:
"Belgian Hares Extraordinary.--Professor Washburn, of Eugene, owns two hares which are among the very best in the state, if not the best. They are from the choicest and most expensive stock of the Meadow Brook Belgian Hare Company, in Los Angeles. Britain Prince Imperial, whose official score is 92.5, was sired by the famous Lord

of the animals. It seems that the principal feed there, for the hares, is oats and alfalfa. The clover or other suitable grass would take the place of alfalfa here in Oregon. It is said that they will eat anything that can be fed to sheep.



Eugene is anxious to secure the location of the proposed I. O. O. F.






