A BERLIN KINDERGARTEN.

One of the best kindergartens in the world is the Pestalozzi-Froebel Haus on the west side of Berlin. The school was begun in 1872 by Frau Shrader. After her death, which occurred only recently, the school passed into the charge of Frau Richter, and its growth has been continued. By gifts, subscriptions and its annual fees for tuition, the school of 200 children is now comfortably housed in a large brick building, which stands in a roomy inclosure.

The work done in the school is much the same as that in the other kindergarten schools, the difference, perhaps, being that here it may be better than usually done elsewhere, as not only are the teachers thoroughly imbued with the Gospel spirit, but naturally its historic growth, counts in favor of the institution. About 75 girls usually form the learning or teacher class in the school, and they in turn become imbued with the spirit of the motto of the school, which in German reads: "Scatter abroad in God's name the riches of the heart, and perhaps from all the seeds will grow a cluster of blossoms."
