REVIEWED STATE MILITIA

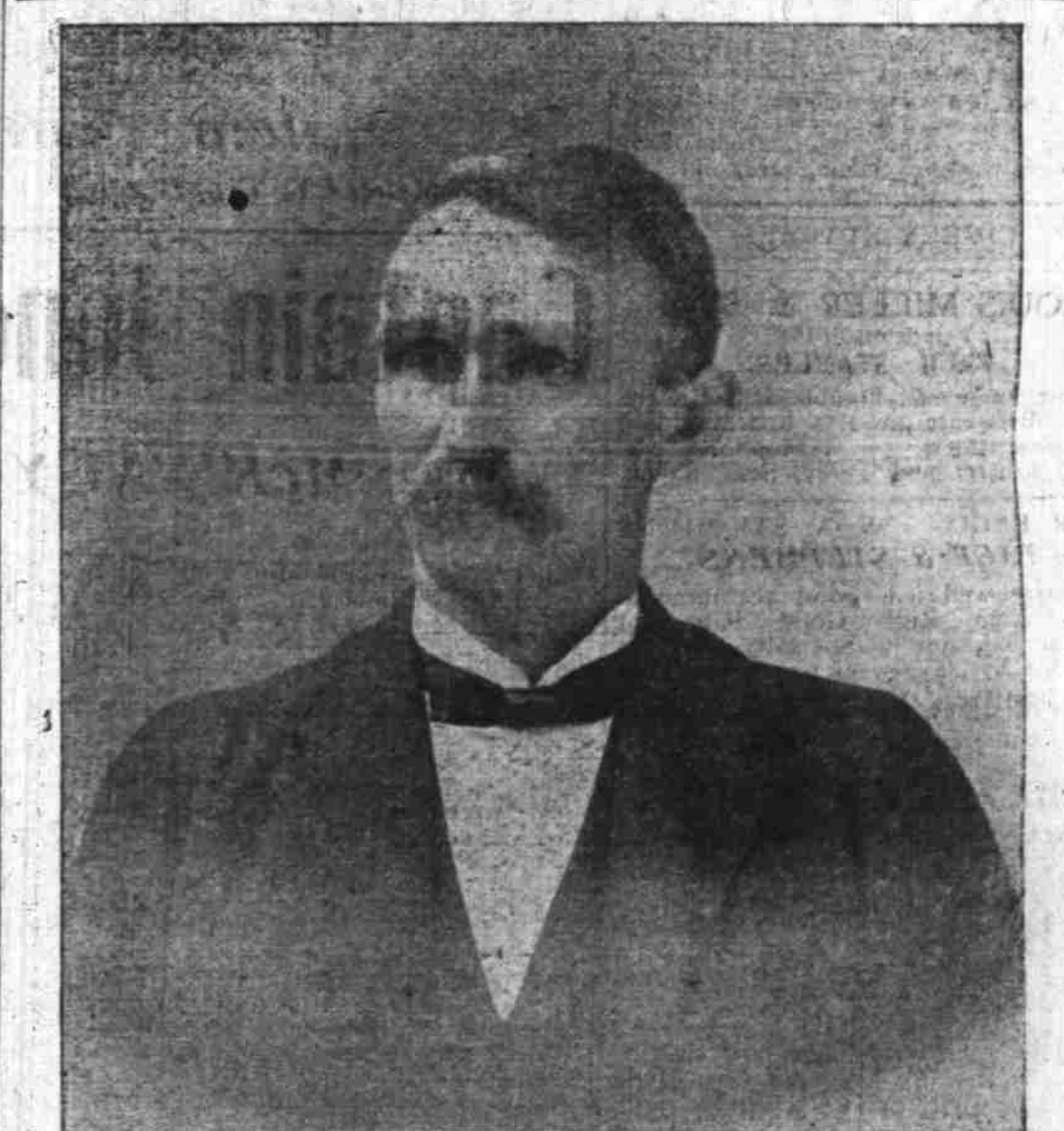
Gov. T. T. Geer and Staff Honored Guests at
the National Guard Encampment.

Entire Strength of the State's Citizen-Soldiery Paraded before
the Chief Executive--A Governor's Salute of 19
Guns--The Daily Routine.

Mounted on a spirited charger
which he sat like a veteran cavalry
officer, Gov. T. T. Geer last evening
reviewing the Oregon National Guard.

It was an inspiring sight to view
the entire strength of the state's mil-
itiamen, the front stretching along the en-
tire length of the parade ground 1500
feet, the brigade front making a mili-
tary spectacle never before seen in
Oregon.

The brigade was in this formation
when Gov. T. T. Geer, attended by his
staff and followed by three troop-
ers as orderlies, appeared at the en-
trance to the parade ground, where
he was met and received by General
