THE HUMPHREY CASE ON TRIAL

Former Warehouse Man Faces a Criminal Charge

CONSIDERABLE TIME SPENT IN SECURING A JURY AND MANY WITNESSES HEARD.

The Defendant Accused of Larceny by Bailment of a Quantity of Wheat Belonging to E. T. Hall, and Stored Last Year—A Point of Law Argued Before Adjournment.

The Humphrey warehouse case came on for trial in the criminal department of the State Circuit Court for Marion county at 1 o'clock yesterday afternoon, and the day was taken up with the drawing of a jury and the examination of witnesses for the State.

The prosecution placed a number of witnesses on the stand, showing that defendant had conducted a warehouse business in this city, and that he was short when called upon for the wheat.

IN SUPREME COURT

A WILL CASE FROM LINN COUNTY IS AFFIRMED.

The Application for a Rehearing of the Verena Wichser-Booth Case Denied by the Court—Other Orders Made.

The Supreme Court yesterday handed down opinions in three appeal cases, heretofore submitted. They are: Andrew J. Ames, respondent, vs. Mary E. Ames, appellant; appeal from Linn county, Hon. R. P. Boise, judge; affirmed.

This is a controversy respecting a will, wherein defendant left his property to his brother and sister, no provision being made for his wife. Undue influence was charged by the wife, and insufficiency of witnesses to the testament. The petitioner for letters of administration, who is the respondent herein, had the petition denied by the probate court.

B. B. Sutton, respondent, vs. W. B. Clarke, et al., appellants; an appeal from Douglas county, Hon. J. W. Hamilton, judge; reversed and remanded. Opinion by Chief Justice R. S. Bean.

This action was commenced to recover \$247.98, alleged to be due on logs delivered to defendant, and payment for which it is to be made in installments. The answer admits the sale, but pleads that the claim has not matured, and in separate answer avers that plaintiff had not delivered all the logs contracted for thus damaging the defendant in the sum of \$300.

Fannie E. Hindman, respondent, vs. S. M. W. Hindman, appellant; appeal from Linn county, Hon. R. P. Boise, judge; affirmed. Opinion per curiam.

The case of C. E. Harmon, appellant, vs. Chas. Decker, respondent, an appeal from Decker county, was argued and submitted by R. C. Smith for appellant, and A. L. Hammond and A. C. Hough for respondent.

vs. Jeannette Booth, administratrix, respondent; rehearing denied. Ellis G. Hughes, appellant, vs. Chas. E. Ladd, et al., respondents; ordered on stipulation that respondents have until April 1st to leave their brief and that appellants have until April 20th to serve their reply.
