

HOPS WILL BE VALUABLE

Horsli's Circular Letter Shows That the Supply of Olds

HAS BEEN EXHAUSTED AND THAT FOR A FEW YEARS THE DEMAND IS LIKELY TO EXCEED THE SUPPLY—ENGLAND'S CROP IS SHORT.

Commenting on these statistics the letter says in part:

The heavy crops for the years 1893, 1894 and 1895 were the result of greatly increased acreage in hops caused by the high prices that ruled in 1890.

At the present time, however, practically all of the surplus stock of new hops, old hops and hop extracts have been used up and when the 1902 hop crop is harvested there will be a clean up of old stock in America such as has not been known for twenty years.

During the past ten years the Pacific Coast hops gained an immense hold on the English and even the German markets.

The English crop this year will run much shorter than the 1901 crop, and 1902 American hops will be much greater than for the 1901 crop.

If prices during the coming season run as high as the present prospects indicate, there is certain to be a wild rush to plant more hops, and in another few years when such new plantings come into bearing, brewers may expect a recurrence of overproduction and low prices.

Of the 1902 Pacific Coast crop something over two-thirds is already in the hands of dealers and brewers, and future prices will depend very much on the activity of buyers in taking over the remaining one-third.

AFFIDAVITS IN MARKLEY CASE

The State Files Sworn Statements in Circuit Court

IN ANSWER TO THOSE PRESENTED BY THE DEFENSE—DENIAL OF ENMITY AGAINST DEFENDANT—A PINKERTON DETECTIVE SAID TO BE AT WORK.

(From Saturday's Daily.)

Deputy District Attorney J. H. McNary yesterday filed some counter-affidavits in the J. F. Markley case, in which the defendant is charged with murdering J. D. Fain, in answer to the affidavits filed by the defense on last Monday urging a postponement of the trial until the October term of the court.

"First—That I am over the age of 21 years and a resident and inhabitant of Champeog, Marion county, Oregon.

"Fourth—That I am not now or ever have been a personal enemy of said defendant, neither am I prejudiced at all against him, and none of the witnesses who testified at either of said examinations are prejudiced against said Markley or are his enemies to my knowledge.

"Fifth—That I am not a party to any conspiracy whatever between the witnesses who have testified at said examinations, or any one else, to secure the conviction of said Markley, neither does any conspiracy whatever exist between said witnesses or any one else to my knowledge.

"Sixth—That I am not aware of any prejudice or bias existing against said defendant in Champeog or in any other part of Marion county, Oregon.

"Seventh—That I have not been active in preventing any witness whatever or any one else in giving any information that they might possess pertaining to the killing of J. D. Fain or that would be of any value to either this defendant or the State of Oregon.

"Eighth—That I have never refused to talk or give what information I possess to any party who might desire it concerning the occurrences of the morning of June 25, 1902, except in one case where a total stranger approached me and stated that his name was Ireland, and that he was one of Pinkerton detectives, and demanded of me, in a very impertinent manner, that I give him a written statement containing what information I had pertaining to the killing of J. D. Fain.

"Ninth—That I am not aware of any prejudice or bias existing against said defendant in Champeog or in any other part of Marion county, Oregon.

"Tenth—That I am well acquainted with the people who live in Champeog and vicinity, and know of no prejudice or bias whatever existing in said community against said defendant.

"Eleventh—That I have for a long time been personally acquainted with said defendant, and during the whole of said time I have been a personal friend of his.

"Twelfth—That I am acquainted with all who testified at the coroner's inquest, and also at the preliminary examination of said defendant, and none of the said witnesses are enemies of the said defendant, or prejudiced against him to my knowledge.

"Thirteenth—That there is no feeling of prejudice or bias whatever against said defendant in Marion county to my knowledge, and none of the witnesses who have heretofore testified at said inquest or said preliminary examination are enemies of said defendant or prejudiced against him to my knowledge.

"Fourteenth—That I have always been personally friendly to said defendant and do not believe that any conspiracy whatever exists between any of said witnesses, or any citizens in Champeog or elsewhere to secure the conviction of said defendant or otherwise.

"Fifteenth—That I am a citizen of Marion county, Oregon, and am over the age of 21 years.

"Sixteenth—That I am well acquainted with the citizens of Champeog, and vicinity, and also with the witnesses who testified at the coroner's inquest and at the preliminary examination of said defendant.

"Second—That on and between the 25th day of June, 1902, and the 7th day of July, 1902, I was the duly appointed and acting deputy sheriff of Marion county, Oregon, and ever since the said date have been the duly elected and qualified sheriff of said county, and during said time I have had charge of the Marion County Jail, in which said defendant has been incarcerated ever since the 25th day of June, 1902.

"Third—That at no time whatever during the incarceration of said defendant have I refused to allow any person who desired to interview or converse with said defendant to do so, and that at no time has said defendant requested that I send for any person whatever to come to said jail to interview him."

The Defense.

The defendant's attorneys, John A. Carson and John B. Gearin, yesterday filed an additional affidavit in support of their motion for a suspension of the trial until the October term of court. The affidavit was that of Frank C. Ireland, a Pinkerton detective of Portland, and the substance in effect was that he had been employed, by Markley's attorneys, to investigate all the circumstances surrounding the killing of Fain and that he called upon C. W. A. Jette, at Champeog, one of the state's witnesses, but that Jette refused to make a statement.

OLD MARION AT THE FAIR

State Board Anxious to Have This County Represented

EIGHT OTHERS HAVE ALREADY DECIDED TO ENTER THE CONTEST FOR COUNTY EXHIBITS, AND WE SHOULD NOT BE MISSING AT OREGON'S EXPOSITION.

Unless some enterprising and home-loving person, who has the interests of Marion county at heart, volunteers his services and exerts his energies in the right direction and this must be done in the near future, the indications are present that "Old Marion" will not be represented at the State Fair this fall in competition for the prizes offered for county exhibits.

Secretary N. J. Judah, of the Greater Salem Commercial Club, yesterday received a communication from Secretary M. D. Wisdom, of the State Board of Agriculture, informing him that the Board, having done all in its power, had not been able to interest anyone sufficiently to take hold of the matter on Marion county's behalf, and the Board now desire to turn the matter over to the Club.

The letter also states that, so far, eight counties have already signified their intention of being represented at the Fair—Jackson, Douglas, Lane, Linn, Benton, Polk, Yamhill and Washington—and was in the hopes that several others would be secured.

Secretary Judah is much concerned about the matter but, as the Club will not have another meeting before fall, he requests that anyone who will volunteer to take the matter in hand for Marion county's sake, kindly communicate with him at the earliest date possible.

"I wish to call your attention to the fact that we have been unable to interest any one in the matter of preparing a county exhibit for the State Fair from Marion county. We left this matter in the hands of Mr. Settlement, your county member of the Board, and he reports that he has been unsuccessful in getting any one to take hold of the matter."

"Now we do not wish to see Marion county out of this contest, and as we have exhausted our resources in this direction, lay the matter before your Club for its consideration. I do not believe it necessary to set forth the many reasons why Marion county should be represented. Other counties have promised us their support in sending in a representative display of their counties' resources, as follows: Jackson, Douglas, Lane, Linn, Benton, Polk, Yamhill and Washington. We have not visited Eastern Oregon yet, and are in hopes of receiving one or two exhibits from that section.

"Please bring this matter before your Club and if your county is not represented at the Fair don't blame the State Board of Agriculture, as it has done everything in its power to interest some one in getting up this exhibit.

"It really seems that Marion county is one county that should need no urging in a matter of this kind. Hoping you will be more successful than we have been, I am Yours Truly,
