

STEAMSHIP SUBSIDIES

THE HOUSE OF COMMONS DIS-CUSSES THE MORGAN SHIP TRUST.

LONDON, July 22 .- The House of Commons Committee appointed to innuire into the question of steamship and that she refused to give them a subsidies was in session this morning physician's aid when they were dying and examined Senator G. ERECT A BUILDING.


