UNITED STATES MARINES

Are Landed at Seoul, Corea, to Afford Protection to American Legation.

Japanese Troops Lying Off Masampho But their Location Is Kept Secret-Neither Country Can Yield.

LONDON, Jan. 6 .- Nobody will suspect the captain of an American man be war of being a scheming alarmist,' says the Standard editorially this Joshua Croffield, the Leader, and Chas, morning.
