According to a communication which has been received by Secretary Winstanley, of the Oregon Hop Growers Association, from Secretary Thomas Ironmonger, of the National Association of English Hop Growers, of Lon don, England, under date of Aug. 5, the hop growers of the Pacific Northwest have everything their own way as to what phice they will accept for English shippers this year that is, a bright, yellow hop, if they will only persevere and not be in too much of a hurry to dispose of their growing crop, cither by contracting or otherwise. 
