# GOVERNOR SHOT

## YOUTHFUL ASSASSIN MAKES A DARING ATTEMPT TO MURDER RUSSIAN OFFICIAL

Entered Victim's Office and Emptied Three Chambers of Revolver Into Miasoff's Person, Inflicting Serious Wound—Is Arrested.

VIBORG, European Russia March 20.—Governor Miasoff was shot and seriously wounded today by a person named. The assassin, who is about 15 years old, obtained entrance to the governor's office and fired three times at him, one bullet inflicting a serious wound and the others slightly wounding the governor in the legs. The governor's clerks and secretary were unable to stop the would-be assassin, who reached the street, where he was arrested without a struggle. The governor's condition is critical.

The youth who shot the governor has been identified as Matti Hjalmar Reinikka, who admits he is a revolutionist. He hails from Kurikka parish, in the northwest part of Finland, but has recently been living in Stockholm to avoid arrest on account of his revolutionary ideas. He returned four days ago to Finland by way of Tornea, and spent three days in Viborg, but declines to reveal his stopping place. Governor Miasoff has been most energetic in the Russification of Finland, and memorials have been sent to the estates petitioning his removal on account of his alleged illegal methods and the general condition in his province, which are pronounced to be intolerable. Reinikka, who lost one of his arms recently in a railway accident, when asked if his name was Reinikka replied: "The police of Helsingfors know me, my motive and the governor's record." The crime was committed with an automatic pistol of the same type as the one with which Hohenthal assassinated Soininen, the procurator general of Finland, on February 6.

## TALE OF GUILT

EX-CONVICT CONFESSES TO MURDER COMMITTED EIGHT YEARS AGO.

Says He Shot Companion and Threw Body Into River—Glaring Eyes of Dead Man Haunt Him Through All These Years.

OAKLAND, Cal., March 20.—Asserting that he had been converted by two evangelists who have been holding meetings in this city, Earl R. Bodine, who says he is an ex-convict, went before Chief of Police Hodgkins today, accompanied by some evangelists, and confessed that eight years ago, near Fairfield, Me., he shot and killed his companion, disposing of the body by throwing it into the Aristook river. He says as the body disappeared the dead man's eyes glared at him, and ever since he has been unable to rid himself of those haunting eyes. An investigation is being made. The authorities believe he is telling the truth.
