SAN FRANCISCO, April 24.--A. Chronicle special from Butte, M. T., says: The Centennial hotel was destroyed by fire early this morning. Jessee B. Gledding, a miner, formerly clerk of the hotel, perished in the flames, and his body burned to a erisp. Frank Lincoln, assistant postmaster of Butte, died from injuries a few hours after being rescued from the burning building. There were over 100 other guests, men, women and children, in the hotel at the time the alarm was their lives, many sustaining slight injuries. The hotel was a two-story frame, and its destruction occupied only thirty minutes. The guests escaped in their night-clothes, losing all their personal effects.
