Lightning Flashes of What the World at Large is Doing. THE BASIN OF THE MACKENZIE. A Spacious Region Where the Surplus Population May Yet Find Homes.

OTTAWA, May 4.—The report of the Schultz commission, appointed to collect information concerning the great Mackenzie river basin, northeast of Alaska, has been accepted by the senate. The commissioners refer to the vast extent of inland navigation, namely, 1360 miles up the Mackenzie being navigable for light draught steamers, 1300 more navigable for stern wheel steamers, and nearly 4000 miles of lake coast.
