POLITICS IN MARION COUNTY.

The Oregon election attracts general interest throughout the country and no end of political advice is proffered from all sides. "The state is republican," we are told in several leading editorials, "by about three thousand on a straight issue," and this majority we are urged to make available in the present contest.

THE GRANT-BADEAU TROUBLE.

Col. Fred Grant, after his lofty scorn of Gen. Badeau's claim for services rendered the deceased hero in the preparation of his memoirs, has so far modified his position as to offer a money compensation to settle the dispute.

The trouble has grown out of the bumpiness of Col. Fred. He has put on airs; treated a trusted secretary of his father with the grossest disrespect, and now he has to eat his words.

Now the illustrious writer is dead, a dispute has arisen as to the extent of the services rendered by Badeau in the preparation of the work. It is admitted that he lived several months in the Grant mansion, laboring daily with the general in his study; and that these joint labors were continued until the second volume was half written.

THE CANDIDATES AT WORK.

The political discussion began at Maricay on Saturday, was continued at Marion on Monday forenoon, where the speakers drew but a small crowd, and in the afternoon it was renewed in Jefferson.
