LETTER FROM ELDER WEBB.

His Labors in Eastern Oregon---Dry Weather and Famishing Crops.

SUMMONED TO MINNEAPOLIS. Travel Through a Sagebrush Country ---Incidents by the Way.

It is about 1500 miles since I wrote you last, and I am almost whirled beyond the recollection of events in connected order. From Arlington I went on to Pendleton, arriving at 1 p. m., and spent till 7 in bed, feeling the need of a good rest.

This town has grown wonderfully and is a great business centre. The magnificent brick schoolhouse on the hill is a big credit mark to the town. The spring is very dry, and people are anxious for rain.

The prohibition county convention was called for the court house. They have the advantage here, as in Dallas, Eugene, Roseburg and some other towns, of not having a court house so high toned that the people cannot meet in it and discuss public interests.

The court house yard is in striking contrast with the surrounding aridity. The shade trees have grown up and spread, and by irrigation the grass is fresh and luxuriant. It is grand for loungers and political button-holders. They find a green sward to recline on, nature holding sunshades over their heads, and a pump of excellent water for a cool drink.

This is hard on the saloons, I admit, but while very freely patronized, it is evidently too thin for the crowd, judging by the throng of visitors to saloons across the street.

PACKING A CONVENTION. When the convention was called to order it was evident that certain republican leaders of the town had packed the hall. They voted in a chairman who worked against the amendment last fall. Then they carried a motion, against the protest of those who had called the convention, that allowed all present to vote.

They next passed resolutions opposing a third party for a third party ticket. This was published in the evening paper, and telegraphed through the state as the action of the regular prohibition convention, notwithstanding the prohibition delegates had retired to the council chamber and nominated a legislative ticket. This move has not only hurt the perpetrators of the fraud, but republicans generally in the county.

Next day took train to Adams, where Dr. L. N. Richardson, son of the late Elder Richardson, of Polk county, (and himself a preacher,) drove me to the Christian church at Hell. The doctor is nominated for the legislature. After a good hearing on a gospel temperance theme, dined at Mr. W. M. Scott's, a former Marion county man. I find a good many former Willamette residents here, and they generally declare they prefer this portion of the state, notwithstanding the country looks so dry.

The doctor drove me to Centreville, which has also grown wonderfully. Elder Neal Cheatham offered his pulpit for a gospel temperance sermon. He draws large audiences.

The country in this part of Unnatilla is rolling; the soil good and easily cultivated. Crops, though needing rain, were not actually suffering; grass is short. At Milton met Dr. Stone, son-in-law of Judge Shaw. Here were brought on the train for sale

THE FIRST RIPE STRAWBERRIES of the season. Fruit and timber are scarce, but do better as you get toward Walla Walla. A flume over twenty miles long floats lumber down from the mountains. A friend was hauling his yearly supply of fire wood a distance of 12 to 15 miles. He said it would take his two four horse teams about eight days to accomplish it. In some parts of Eastern Oregon fire wood is 30 miles distant. Think of that, ye favored Willamettes!

There ought to be a good market for some of our fruits here, though the Walla Walla country is raising a great many berries and some larger sorts. Timber culture claims and artificial groves look weak, most straggly, stunted box elder. But the grain fields, without stork, stump or stone to interrupt long, straight furrows, are vast.

At Milton, Weston and Centreville had good prohibition meetings;

Gen. Sheridan Better. WASHINGTON, May 28th.—Gen. Sheridan's physicians issued the following bulletin this morning: "Gen. W. H. H. Darby; has a field of wheat headed out, he thinks will be ready to harvest by the first of July, which is rather early for grain cutting in the hills.

They are Italian laborers, unable to speak English, brought here in the expectation of finding railway work. What they do or how they live seems a mystery. How this country is filling up with foreign immigration! And to think that in a year, before they can read the state or national constitution without translation, they become voters, even office holders and lawmakers! California's law is surely liberal enough, five years' residence after declaring intentions, before citizenship or permission to vote. Now we are in Minneapolis, where the traveler encounters thousands of Scandinavians and Germans. But more in my next.
