BERLIN, June 17.—An extraordinary rumor is current in this city which has caused a most intense sensation. It appears that notwithstanding the urgent entreaties and protests of the widowed Empress that no autopsy should be performed on the body of the dead monarch, the new Emperor caused a post mortem examination to be made yesterday.

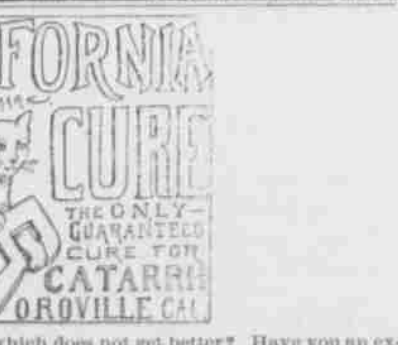
