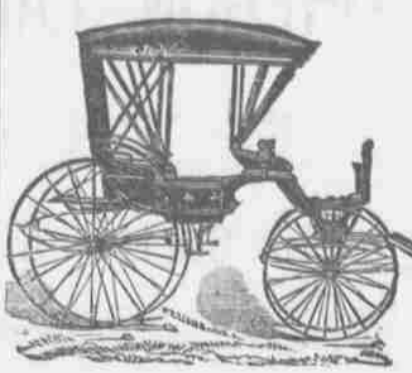

Forest fires have raged over an area of 120 miles on the Italian frontier. A number of villages have been burned.

In Spokane Falls yesterday, the residence of J. C. Odell was burned by an incendiary, during the absence of the family. Loss \$3,000.

Harland & Wolff, shipbuilders in Belfast, Ireland, have closed their yards in consequence of a strike. Five thousand hands are affected.

Michael Murray, the short stop of a New York base ball club, was struck in the neck yesterday by a pitched ball, and the vertebrae was broken by the blow.

The pound-keeper at San Diego has handed in his resignation to the city council. He says his life is in danger from those who resent the acts of his deputies.

Rev. E. H. Comp, a prominent Presbyterian preacher, committed suicide in New York on Sunday night. He had recently returned from Palestine, but had grown discouraged with continued ill health.

Henry Villard's connection with a south polar expedition has been affirmed and denied in the newspapers several times. It is now re-affirmed that his office in New York is busy with preparations, and that volunteers to man the expedition are coming in by the hundred.

TELEGRAPHIC SUMMARY.

The Peach Crop.

NEW YORK, Aug. 20.—The average weekly receipts of peaches reach 275,000 baskets and half goes to fill orders from other cities. One of the largest receivers says the Delaware crop is not as large as expected. Still the crop will probably exceed 5,000,000 baskets.

The Senate Tariff Bill.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 20.—It is now said that the tariff bill will not be reported to the senate for perhaps a month, in which event the adjournment of congress can hardly be brought about before the middle of October, and possibly later. The senate committee is "making haste slowly." It is not disposed to attempt to do in two or three weeks the task that the house committee was over four months upon.

Slaughter of the Innocents.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 20.—The awful mortality among infants continues. Since April 7 over 800 children under three years of age have died, and for the last two weeks deaths have averaged ten daily. It is charged by a writer on a Sunday paper that impure milk causes the fearful death rate. He boldly avows that no more than fifty gallons of pure milk are daily sold in this city, the balance being adulterated.

Furness Trusts and Combines.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21.—Representative Breckenridge, of Arkansas, introduced five tariff bills in the house to-day. It is stated in the titles that they are intended to correct certain abuses arising under the present tariff bill, and he defines these abuses more closely as growing out of the system of trusts. He does not expect that a general tariff bill will be passed during this session of congress, and introduces these bills in the hope that congress may put a check upon trusts by passing these specific bills reducing the duties on the articles on which they operate.

Mammon Before Salvation.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 20.—Before the Congregational Club to-day Rev. Mr. Oakley, of San Bernardino spoke of the late boom in real estate and its effect upon the churches in Southern California. The boom had burst now, and they were hoping for better things, but it had been a great injury to the churches' work. Some of the brethren had lost their heads in the boom. When people were making or hoping to make a thousand or ten thousand dollars a day during the boom, you couldn't fasten their attention on their sins. Since the boom had burst they were in a more penitent state of mind.

Imported Laborers.

WALLA WALLA, Aug. 20.—A special to the Statesman from Pasco, Sunday night, says an importation of 450 Italians from the East are expected on a train to-morrow morning bound for Roslyn, to take the places of the miners now employed in the coal mines there.

A gentleman just from Roslyn says the miners are determined that the Italians shall not displace them, and are arming for the purpose of keeping out the would-be invaders. Detective Sullivan, "spotter" for the Northern Pacific and other railroads, who is also deputy U. S. marshal and deputy sheriff of nearly all the counties in the territory, is here with twenty-five men, all armed with Winchester rifles. They will accompany the Italians to Roslyn for their (the Italians') protection. The outcome is awaited with great interest by the people here.
