**A Chinese Baby.**  
What is said to be a Chinese baby was born in Chinatown yesterday and when the naming of the baby comes there'll be lots of fun. The baby is a boy. No sooner is a Chinese boy born into the world than his father proceeds to write down eight characters or words, each set of two representing the exact hour, day, month and year of his birth. These are handed by the father to a fortune-teller, whose business it is to draw up from them a certain book of fate, generally spoken of as the boy's pater, or "eight characters." Herein the fortune-teller describe the good and evil which the boy is likely to meet with in after life and the means to be adopted to secure the one and avert the other. —Astorian.

**Alaska's Great Mines.**  
"It will surprise you, I dare say," said A. K. Delaney, collector of customs at Sitka, Alaska, to an Astorian reporter, "to know that the greatest gold mine in the world is situated at James City, about 150 miles from Sitka. I state it however as a fact. It is called the Paris mine, and one of the principal owners is Senator Jones, of Nevada. The mine produces from \$75,000 to \$100,000 worth of gold bullion per month, and experts say that enough is in sight to furnish that amount for 400 years. If this be true, and I have no reason to doubt it, the mine ought to be worth several hundred million to the syndicate which controls it. One-half of the mine was originally purchased for \$650. For the other half a trifle more was paid."

**How To Strengthen Trees.**  
That the present and past season have been unusually large in fruit bearing is clearly shown by the large number of trees that have been broken down by the weight of fruit this year, some of the trees having been ruined forever by splitting from the forks downward. As a means of guarding against a like occurrence, the American Farmer says: "Twist together one twig from each of the main branches. Twigs which grow from the lower part of the branches are preferable. If there are no such twigs, a water sprout or sucker should be allowed to grow, or one may be started by nicely inserting a scion into a slit between the bark and the wood and securely waxing it. Twigs from the size of a pencil to half-inch in diameter can be used for this purpose. Their ends should not be clipped for a year or two after they are first twisted by this time they will begin to adhere, and all the twigs and leaves may be cut from the newly formed branch."

**DEMOCRATIC EXTRAVAGANCE.**  
The government income for the current first year, beginning July 1, is estimated at \$383,000,000, or \$220,000,000 tariff, \$130,000,000 internal revenue and the rest miscellaneous. This ought to leave a surplus of \$130,000,000. The surplus, less sinking fund, will not be a tenth of this.  
The house has primary charge, under the constitution, both of revenue and expenditure. The senate has not. The house has a good party majority of 12 to 16. The senate has a bare party majority of but two.

The Democratic party has always talked economy and practiced extravagance. The Republican party in the days of its most complete control never approached the reckless expenditure of the present house. Its Democratic majority has found a short way to deal with the surplus. It has spent it.

The aggregate appropriations made or making are \$257,000,000; the permanent appropriation for interest, etc., are \$68,000,000; the sinking fund, a good deal of a sham, but required by law, is \$47,000,000, total, \$372,000,000. Take this from the receipts and there is \$12,000,000 left. This is the beggarly total to which the surplus is cut down by Democratic extravagance. Abolish the sinking fund and it would stand at \$96,000,000, two thirds the expected total.

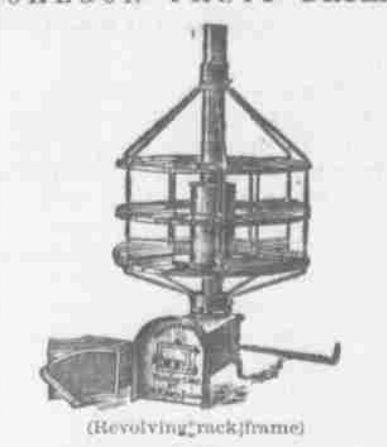
The ready answer is that the house has voted money for future years. How much? Part of the biggest river and harbor bill ever known. A little of the appropriations for guns and ships, in all, stretch it as you will, \$12,000,000. Allow for this and the surplus stands at \$80,000,000.  
A resolution two lines long cutting off the tobacco taxes would dispose of half the surplus at its biggest figure; but the Democratic house will not reduce the surplus save by disordering industry. It will not relieve the farmer unless it can disturb the manufacture. —Philadelphia Press.

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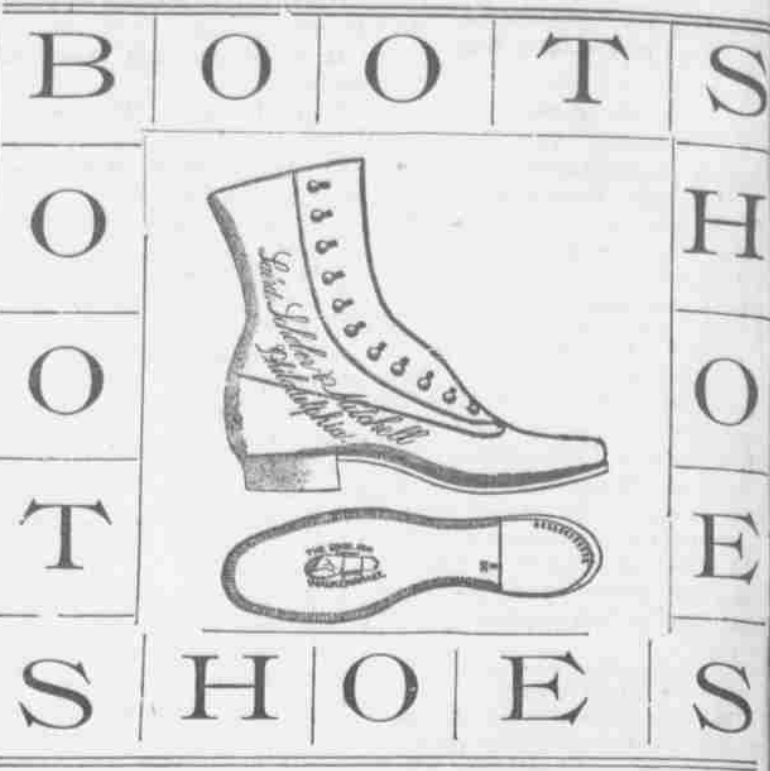
