G. A. R. IN POLITICS.

Gen. John M. Palmer was a candidate for Governor in Illinois. He is a democrat and also a member of the G. A. R. organization.

As the returning Congressmen assemble in Washington and exchange views regarding the late election, the opinion becomes more general that the tariff, after all, was only an incident, and not, except in certain cases, a potent factor in the campaign.

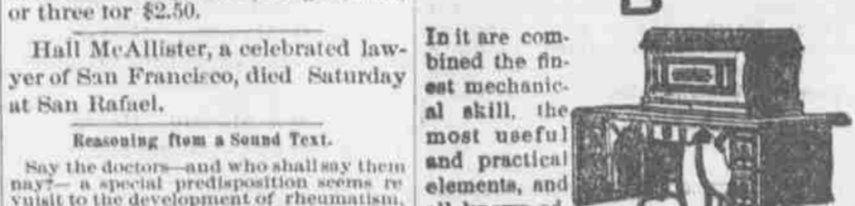
