Important Events of the Whole World for Twenty-four Hours.

Another Big Railroad.

STOUX CITY, Iowa, Dec. 31.-There is a glowing feeling of confidence here in the intentions of the company that has been organized to build the proposed line of road from Sioux City to Ogden and thence to the Pacific coast. Local capitalists are interested and the work of securing terminal facilities has already progressed to some extent. The line was surveyed last summer, and considerable work done at the west end, where a certain amount of grading is necessary to hold a line of survey from other roads that may be seeking passage through the same mountain canyon or narrow pass.

Protective Democrats Secede.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 31.- It is stated that protection democrats, especially those in the South, are making arrangements for holding a convention, when they will issue an ultimatum to the free trade wing of the party. The latter will be notified that, unless the democratic party returns to the platform of 1884, the protection democrats will leave them and either join the republicans or nominate an independent ticket.

CHICAGO, Dec. 31.- Master in Chancery Windes, to whom was referred the anarchist petition for an injunction restraining the police from interfering with their meetings, rendered a decision, recommending the granting of an injunction, on the ground that no property rights are involved, and that there is no precedent for granting such injunction.

He swore out a warrant under which the entire male population of the place were arrested and taken to Greely Center, where they will be tried.
