THE UNIVERSAL MEASURES.

The metric system of weights and measures is now obligatory by law in the Argentine Republic, Austria and Hungary, Belgium, Bolivia, Brazil, Chili, Columbia, Denmark, Ecuador, France and colonies, Germany, Greece, Italy, Mexico, Netherlands, Norway, Paraguay, Peru, Portugal, Roumania, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland, with a total population of 241,973,011.
