Judge Shaw, fighting the Indian Battle Over, After Many Years (correspondence of the Capital Journal). I left off where we went into camp near Tye bridge on the Deschutes river, after we had tried our hands for the first time with the redskins. We were all tired and worn out and soon retired to our couches, which consisted of two blankets to the man, and were soon asleep.

Our way was up a creek and a deep canyon and the trail was so narrow at some places we had to go single file. We marched on until about ten o'clock when we came to what had been the Indian camp, which had been deserted the evening before, and by following the trail of the retreating foe we found that they had made a hasty retreat, leaving a good many articles that were valuable to them if they could have carried them away.
