Testing Diamonds.

It doesn't require an expert to tell whether a diamond is genuine or not. The test is very simple, and can be made in any place and in a moment. All you need is a piece of paper and a lead pencil. With the latter make a small dot on the paper, then look at it through the diamond. If you can see but one dot you can depend upon it that the stone is genuine, but if the mark is scattered, or shows more than one, you will be perfectly safe in refusing to pay ten cents for a stone that has been offered to you at \$500. A blue stone may be tested by a bath in alcohol. Many yellow stones are made blue by an application of ammonia, and this is overcome by the alcohol.—St. Louis Globe-Democrat.
