SHALL WE MEET AGAIN?

The following is one of the most brilliant articles written by the lamented George D. Prentice:

The flat of nature is inexorable. There is no appeal for relief from the great law which dooms to dust. We flourish and fade as the leaves of the forest, and the flowers that bloom and wither in a day have no feater hold upon life than the mightiest monarch that ever shook the earth with his footsteps.

Views of the Northpole Prof. J. B. Trombly of Talent, who is deeply interested in scientific researches, sends the Record the following, taken from Brick Pomeroy's Advance Thought.

A year ago last fall an American inventor and scientist, Mr. George A. Treadwell, formerly of Oakland, Cal., but at present in London, and who is now associated in scientific matters with Sir John Lubbock, Fellow of the Royal Society of London, and also M. P., conceived an original and ingenious mode of determination in the character of the country around the North Pole without physical inspection.

A few days ago an experimental train upon a railroad in Pennsylvania made a run of about ninety odd miles in about sixty minutes, some portion of the journey being at a rate of nearly two miles per minute.

Marked progress has been made toward solving the problem of aerial navigation, and although it is yet impossible to predict the ultimate outcome, it is not insanity to believe that air ships may yet be run counter to the winds.

The demand for artificial fertilizer at the east has led to the scouring of prairies for the bones of buffalo and other animals. Great heaps of these remains, which include also the bones of many an unfortunate prospector and ranchman, are piled along the line of railroad near Helena ready for shipment to the east, where they are ground up.

A NEW aristocracy is being founded in New York. Antonio Aste, an Italian, started business as a boot-black at five years of age. He has long been a boss shiner, owns several stands and a number of buildings well rented, all earned with the brush.

In one place 200 and in another 175 people were doubled up by ice cream. In Adair, Iowa, every physician in the place partook of the tyrotoxicating dish, and when paigs seized the 175 aching stomachs the hands that should have worked the stomach-pump were in agony clasped over the howling abdomens of their owners.
